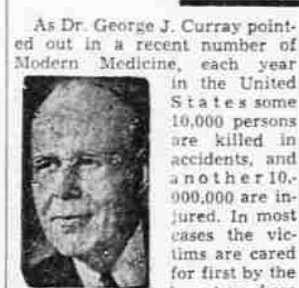

The Medical Roundup

As Dr. George J. Curran pointed out in a recent number of Modern Medicine, each year in the United States some 10,000 persons are killed in accidents, and another 10,000,000 are injured. In most cases the victims are cared for first by the bystanders who see the accident, and sometimes, in their desire to help, these people do great harm. For instance, if a man's back is broken, but his spinal cord is still functioning, his future life depends on how carefully he is handled as he is gotten onto a stretcher and into a hospital bed. Rough handling may cause destruction of the spinal cord, and then the man will be hopelessly paralyzed.

Sometimes a man almost loses function in an arm or leg because a tight tourniquet was put on and not soon released. All of us must remember that if blood is completely shut off from tissues they must soon die. Because of this, in the city of Flint, Michigan, great efforts are now being made to teach people in general, and ambulance drivers in particular, what to do and what not to do to persons who have been injured.

Among the instructions given I note the following: Quickly look for and treat serious bleeding; also stoppage of respiration. Fractures should be splinted before the person is moved. Burns and wounds should be covered as soon as possible with a sterile dressing. Especially in winter, every effort should be made to

Around Hollywood

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Movie-town ballyhoo has invaded royalty — Prince Rainier III has

hired a Hollywood press agent for his postage-stamp country of Monaco.

Hollywood publicists handle everything, from Forest Lawn Cemetery to

Lassie, the four-footed hero of television. Now even his royal highness and his wife, that bricklayer's daughter from Philadelphia, have decided their country needs a drum-beater to bring in more tourists.

Marilyn and Marlon

Publicist Arthur P. Jacobs, who handles press relations for such stars as Marilyn Monroe and Marlon Brando, acquired the royal client.

"The Arthur P. Jacobs office has been retained to handle the official activities of the Principality of Monaco," a notice in Variety, the show business trade paper, announced with dignity.

Usual Hollywood colorful publicity tactics will be subdued for this account. According to a How-to-Publicize-Monaco manuscript the publicity office has prepared, the little country will be promoted as "railroads and big corporations."

"The country will give scholarships and various prizes," a spokesman at the office says.

"One of our jobs will be to establish the difference between Monte Carlo and Monaco. The ordinary tourist thinks gambling is all there is to do in Monaco."

"We will not use stunts, but a good high-level of American public relations such as used by Palm Springs or any other resort area."

"Monaco never has had a tourist bureau. Why, they don't even give you a sticker for your suitcase."

The Monaco press agent's first job will be to handle publicity for his two famous bosses when they arrive in the United States this week. Jacobs has numerous activities lined up for the pair, including a press conference on board ship in New York.

The reaction to this royal publicity account has been varied around filmtown.

A Veritable Coup

"It's a wonderful coup for one of our members to get such a distinguished account," said Don Burdette, president of the Screen Publicists' Guild. "The once-maligned Hollywood press agent is coming into his own."

Jacobs' other clients who are in town appeared pleased.

"This is sensational," said producer Julian Blaustein. "Now perhaps through my press agent I can get the prince and his wife in a movie."

The press agent for Forest Lawn has no comment. But Lassie's press agent did. "Where would dogs be without press agents?" he shrugged.

Pilot, Passenger of Small Plane Killed

Merced, Calif. — (U.P.) — The pilot of a small plane and his passenger were killed Saturday when their airplane crashed 13 miles southwest of here.

Alfonso Torres, 29, the pilot, died in the crash along with his passenger, Patrick Daniel Nolet, 16, son of one of the co-owners of the Miles Trucking company, a well-known Merced firm.
