

Cancer Society to Launch Extensive Education Program

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The extensive public education program of the American Cancer Society will save the lives of a third of the estimated 450,000 Americans developing cancer this year, according to the top staff officer of the society.

Mefford R. Runyon, ACS executive vice president, added that the fatality figure could be cut even further "if our present knowledge and resources were put to full use."

Runyon is here to address an ACS seven-state meeting which opened a three-day session today.

Runyon also announced the election of Dr. David A. Wood, director of the Cancer Research Center at the University of California, as president of the American Cancer Society. Wood has been a director-at-large since 1954.

Single Achievement

The society's crusade "to awaken people to the consequences of cancer neglect" is the greatest single achievement of the American Cancer Society, Runyon said.

But, he warned, while more people are aware of the danger of cancer, statistical studies by the society have indicated a decided rise in the number of cancer deaths.

According to ACS figures, the cancer death in 1934 was 106 per 100,000 population. By 1940 it had jumped to 140. It was 142 in 1947, 143 in 1953 and 148 in 1955.

The steady fatality gain, Runyon said, reflected the greater number of persons who "are living into the cancer age of 60-85 years."

Much Unknown

"However elusive the cause and ultimate cure of cancer," Runyon said, "much about its nature and tactics is now known, and the large-scale counter-offensive on three major fronts — research, service and education — has made advances sufficiently reassuring to warrant the current hope for a much earlier victory than was anticipated a decade ago."

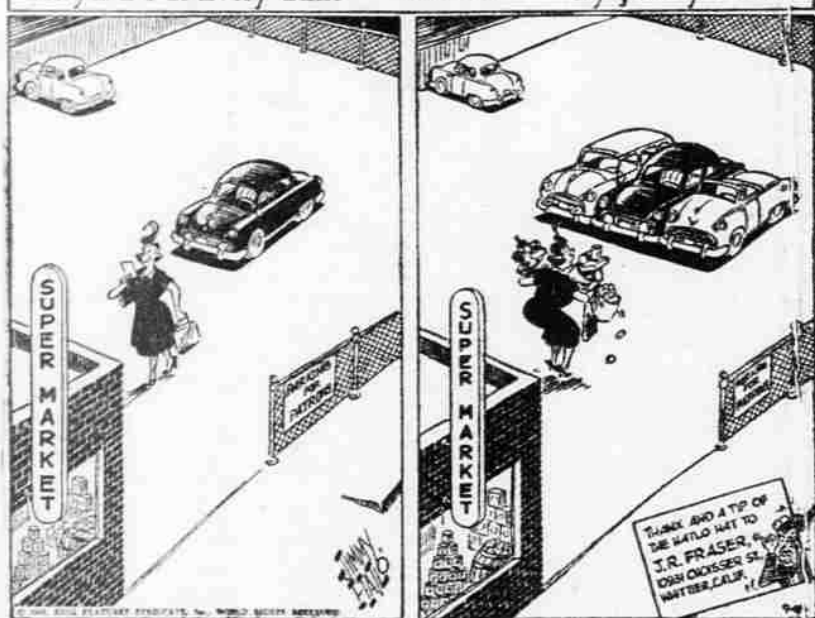
"Ten years ago, only one in four of those who developed cancer was saved. Now one in three is saved," he said.

Terminal Planned For Trailer-Ships

Berkeley, Calif. — (U.P.) — Plans for a \$2 million trailer-ship terminal at Long Beach, Calif., were revealed Monday at the annual convention of the Pacific Coast Association of Port Authorities.

The report of the Committee on Harbor Improvements said the new facility, designed for ships carrying loaded truck trailers, will be completed late next year.

The report also discussed harbor improvement programs at San Francisco, Seattle and Honolulu.

Two tentative plans for trailer-ship terminals have been prepared at San Francisco but neither is being developed pending a definite commitment that firms entering trailer-ship trade intend to serve the Bay area.

Seattle's chief project is a \$3 million sea-rail terminal for ships carrying loaded freight cars between there and ports in Alaska. The service is expected to be inaugurated in 1958.

A 47 million port expansion program is underway in Honolulu to prepare for nine new passenger liners that will go into service at 1960.

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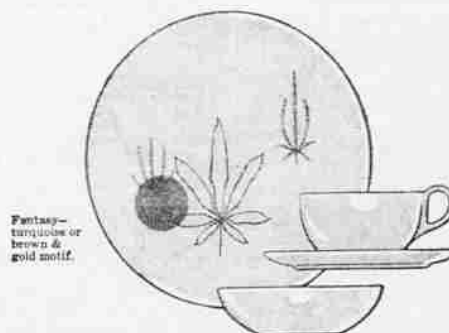
