

Gov. J. Bracken Lee Defeated In Utah's Gubernatorial Race

Close races for U.S. Senate nominations in the Wisconsin and Colorado races hung in balance today with the final counting of primary election votes in several states across the nation.

Prime interest centered in Wisconsin where veteran GOP Sen. Alexander Wiley fought for nomination to a fourth term and his political life. He was opposed by young congressman Glenn Davis, who had the backing and financial support of the state's regular GOP organization.

In Colorado, former Congressman John A. Carroll held the lead over Charles F. Brannan, a secretary of agriculture in the Truman administration, in the Democratic senatorial race. Carroll, who served two terms in Congress, pulled 47,076 votes to 43,124 for Brannan.

Big surprise was the defeat of Gov. J. Bracken Lee by political newcomer George D. Clyde in Utah's GOP gubernatorial battle. Lee hoped to win the nomination and seek an unprecedented third term as the state's governor.

Big Surprise

Lee took an early lead, but soon lost it to Clyde, who campaigned on a promise to back the Eisenhower administration 100 per cent.

L. C. Romney — Salt Lake

City commissioner — led Attorney John S. Boyden of Salt Lake City for the Democratic gubernatorial bid. State Sen. Alonzo F. Hopkin held a solid lead over former Gov. Herbert B. Maw in the Democratic senatorial race.

Vermont was the first state to render a decision, with Republican incumbents renominated without opposition. They included U. S. Sen. George D. Aiken, Gov. Joseph B. Johnson and U. S. Rep. Winston L. Prouty.

Unopposed Democratic winners were E. Frank Brannon for the governorship, and Bernard O'Shea, a weekly newspaper publisher who hoped to unseat Aiken.

Two Republicans Win
In New Hampshire, Gov. Lane Dwinell, U. S. Sen. Norris Cotton and the two GOP congressmen of the state were renominated.

Dwinell, an Eisenhower supporter, had the closest battle with Attorney Wesley Powell.

GOP Reps. Chester E. Morrow and Perkins Bass were winners again on their party tickets. Morrow will oppose Democratic Attorney James B. Sullivan and Bass will face nursing home operator George F. Brown in November.

Anchor Nelson, former REA

administrator, was nominated on the Republican ticket to oppose Gov. Orville Freeman in the Minnesota gubernatorial contest in November. Nelsen and Freeman—a Democrat—easily won nomination over several political unknowns.

All nine of the state's congressmen—five Democrats and four Republicans—were renominated. The Democrats were unopposed, and included Mrs. Coya Knutson, the state's first congresswoman. Former pro basketball star George Mikan won nomination on the Republican ticket to oppose incumbent Rep. Roy Weir in November.

Alexander Wiley Wins Wisconsin Senate Nomination

Madison, Wis. — (U.P.) — Sen. Alexander Wiley won his bid for the Wisconsin senatorial nomination today after a down to the wire battle with Rep. Glenn Davis.

Davis sent Wiley a telegram conceding the election early this morning, after the veteran senator had opened a gap of about 10,000 votes between them.

Davis told Wiley "I wish you well" and urged all Republicans to back Wiley in his effort to win a fourth six-year term in November against the Democratic candidate, state Sen. Henry Maier.

Howard Boyle Jr., the third candidate, was out of the race early.

With 3,298 of the state's 3,353 precincts reporting, the Republican vote was:
Wiley 215,981.
Davis 205,366.
Boyle 19,931.

Appears 'Serene'

Wiley's son, Marshall, said the senator went to bed about 10 p.m. Tuesday and appeared "serene" about the outcome.

The state has seen nothing approaching the Wiley-Davis battle since the 1946 Senate primary that started Sen. Joseph McCarthy on his way to Washington. McCarthy beat the late Sen. Robert M. LaFollette Jr., that year by 5,396 votes, starting even in this politically volatile state.

The two-way Democratic senate primary was a similar race during the early vote counting. But as returns piled in state Sen. Henry Maier, Milwaukee, pulled ahead of former state Democratic Chairman Elliott Walstead, also a Milwaukeean. Walstead conceded at the two-third mark in counting.

With 3,057 of the state's 3,353 precincts reporting, the Democratic vote was: Maier 133,623 and Walstead 72,265.

Denies Pilots Had Applied for Jobs

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Claims by the San Francisco Egyptian Consul that 30 Bay Area pilots had applied for jobs with the nationalized Suez Canal was branded as "just Egyptian government publicity" by an officer of the Masters, Mates and Pilots Union.

Capt. John Cross, secretary-treasurer of Local 90, said the Local's members cannot take jobs with any employer with whom the union does not have a contract without getting clearance from the union.

And he said none had done so locally.

Capt. J. A. Gannon, president of Local 40, whose members pilot boats on the San Francisco Bay and inland waters, said he knew of only one pilot who had inquired about the Suez job—and he wasn't sure if that man had actually filed application.

Democratic State Senator, GOP Lt. Governor Elected

Seattle, Wash. — (U.P.) — A Democratic state senator and a Republican lieutenant governor yesterday won primary election nominations for governor in Washington State where the big battle for a U.S. Senate seat must wait until November.

The Senate battle between incumbent Democrat Warren G. Magnuson and Republican Gov. Arthur B. Langlie was little more than a "popularity contest" because neither was opposed in the primary.

This left the contest for the job Langlie was vacating the major race. And one of the primary factors in the battle was the fact that supporters of Langlie also were rooting for Anderson, a former National Grand Exalted Ruler of the Elks.

Anderson Defeats Eastvold
Anderson's main opponent was Attorney General Don Eastvold, who ironically helped Langlie carry the ball for President Eisenhower in the GOP convention four years ago.

Unemployment in Auto Industry To Start Dropping

Detroit — (U.P.) — Unemployment in Michigan's auto industry is expected to start dropping soon now that the model change-over period is ending and 1957 new car production gets underway.

John S. Bugas, Ford Motor Co. vice president, said yesterday he expects the firm's present 127,000 man work force to increase by more than 8,000 during the next 30 days and by 10 per cent over the next four months.

Bugas said preliminary estimates indicate the Ford work force will reach 140,000 by the end of this year.

Sizeable Hikes
General Motors Corp. and Chrysler Corp., also were expected to brighten the unemployment picture by making sizeable hikes in their production forces by December.

GM said it hoped to have all its laid-off workers with at least 90 days seniority back on the job by Christmas. GM has never revealed how many of its workers have been laid off but the United Auto Workers union estimated the giant auto firm idled at least 30,000 earlier this summer.

Chrysler did not indicate how many of its idled employees it planned to call back but the figure was expected to be a sizeable one.

At mid-August, Michigan unemployment stood at 258,000, according to the State Employment Security commission, with auto industry layoffs accounting for most of the idleness.

Changeovers
The commission said auto model changeovers were responsible for most of the unemployment with 175,000 of the total, or 11.5 per cent of the labor force, living in the Detroit area.

Meanwhile, additional jobs were expected to result from a three-day Defense department procurement clinic here which is aimed at securing defense contracts for the state's small businesses.

Walker L. Cislir, president of Detroit Edison Co., told delegates to the clinic that Michigan must have increased defense spending if it hopes to cut its unemployment rolls.

Cislir said the ranks of the idled may increase to 270,000 before new car production gets underway but pointed out that this figure could be cut by expanding the state's defense industries.

Canadian Air Ace Dies in Palm Beach

Palm Beach, Fla. — (U.P.) — Funeral arrangements for World War I Canadian Air Ace William Avery Bishop were delayed today pending notification of his son and daughter of his death.

Bishop, who shot down 72 enemy planes during the first World War and became the British Empire's greatest air ace of all time, died at his winter home here Tuesday at the age of 62.

An illness of a year's duration had prevented his return to his native Canada last summer. He had spent winters here for the past 20 years.

Seattle, a Seattle lawyer, handily defeated Secretary of State Earl Coe for the nomination.

With the tally at the halfway mark, Anderson had rolled up 92,705 votes to Eastvold's 46,769. Rosellini had 110,284 to 66,009 for Coe.

Eastvold and Coe conceded defeat.

Magnuson Outpicks Langlie
In the Senate tally, Magnuson had 209,013 votes while Langlie, President Eisenhower's "personal choice" had 147,064.

The state's seven U.S. Representatives—six Republicans and one Democrat—were unopposed or leading by large margins.

Johnny Cherberg, fired last fall as head football coach at the University of Washington, was

winner of the Democratic nomination for lieutenant governor in his first political try.

Incumbent Pearl A. Wanamaker, co-author of the controversial financial report drafted at

the 1956 White House Conference on Education was in a nip-and-tuck battle with State Sen. Lloyd J. Andrews for the office of superintendent of public instruction.

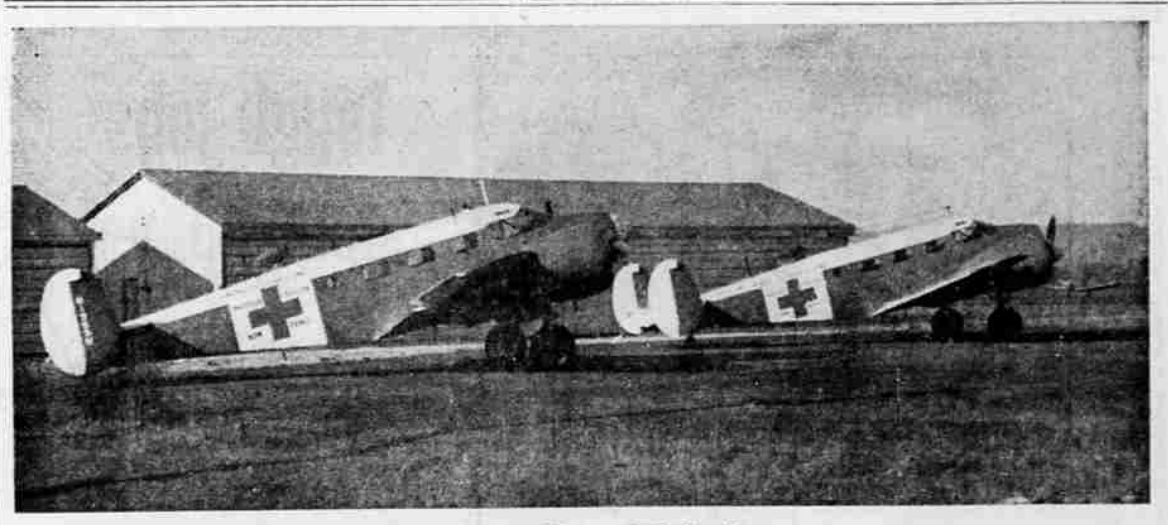
