ARE THE NEW CALMING DRUGS DANGEROUS?

People keep asking me if there is any danger in the unlimited and continued use of the new, so-called "wonder drugs" which have a calming effect, and often times help the person with a mental disturbance. The answer is that these drugs, which so often do great good, can all do harm if taken by someone who is highly sensitive to them, or who takes them for too long a time or in too large doses. Hence, their administration should be supervised by a physician. What is important is that all patients know enough to quit taking the drug and to consult their physician the day after or distressing symptoms appear.

For instance: when taking chlorpromazine, if the person's eyes begin to look yellow, he should stop taking the drug and should immediately see his physician. With a snake-root or Rauwolfia type of drug the patient should stop taking the medicine if he should get mentally disturbed, or if he should begin to feel stiff in his muscles and to lose expression in his face. Persons taking the Miltown type of drug should know that they should not run up the dose foolishly, because cases of habituation have been reported. POLYPS IN THE INTESTINES

Many an elderly person is worried when a roentgenologic (x-ray) study of the colon, or

large bowel of a healthy boy of 14 who had been killed in an auto accident. Since I have very rarely seen a case of cancer of the colon in a person under the age of 28, I strongly suspected that if this boy had lived, his polyp would have lain dormant for many years. I remember, also, an elderly woman in whose colon there had been found 3 large polyps. Because at the time she was mentally disturbed, I did not want her operated on, and so I just had the polyps looked at every six months. The woman, lived several years, during which time the polyps did not show any tendency to grow. Eventually

she died of some other illness. Fortunately, polyps in the rectum and sometimes even in the sigmoid flexure just above, the rectum can be destroyed by a proctologist. Working through an electrically-lighted tube he can cauterize or burn up the polyps with the help of very hot electrical sparks. Certainly, polyps, when discovered, should not be forgotten and neglected. They should be watched, and if they show signs of growing they should be removed. When the patient is old or feeble or in poor shape for an operation, his physician will be justified in postponed surgical intervention.

Garden Notes

Mid-September is an excellent time to seed new lawns. The weather is warm enough to cause prompt germination of the seed but not so hot as to make watering a burdensome factor.

Two things which are very important in planting a lawn are proper preparation of the seed bed and the selection of proper lawn seed. It is always a mistake to hastily prepare a seed bed and then seed before the soil has had ample opportunity to settle. This will invariably result in an uneven lawn.

Selection of a good, level well compacted seed bed has been developed and you are ready to seed. Then the seed selection problem appears. Red creeping fescue and Kentucky bluegrass are two of our better lawn seeds. Bentgrasses which are so satisfactory along the coast and in the more humid Willamette valley are very disappointing in this area unless they are given the very best of care as regards fertilizer and moisture they will turn brown in hot weather.

With most people this care is so exacting that the lawns turn brown in spite of them. As a result, bentgrasses should be avoided even in small quantities in lawn mixtures. Merion bluegrass is a new type of grass which makes a good tight turf but grows much more slowly and as a result does not need as frequent mowing.

Any of these grasses can be planted at the rate of one pound to 250 square feet. Some people prefer clover in their lawns in which case a quarter of a pound of white Dutch clover could also be used with the grass. Clover has the advantage of requiring less water and fertilizer but as the leaves bruise easily, they stain clothing rather readily.

While now is an ideal time for lawn seeding, they can continue to be seeded up until early October with good success.

Average weight of the fleece snipped from sheep in the United States is about eight or more pounds, according to government inspector estimates.

Word received today by Morris Leonard Sr., Jackson county savings bond sales chairman, indicated that sales of United States treasury E and H savings bonds in Jackson county amounted to \$828,758 in August.

The report was issued by George M. Minnaugh, state director of bond sales. The total for August, 1955, was \$801,942. Minnaugh said Oregonians set a peace-time record for themselves in their E and H bond purchases last month. They bought a total of \$4,189,409.70 worth of these securities, the highest August figure since the 1945 war days.
