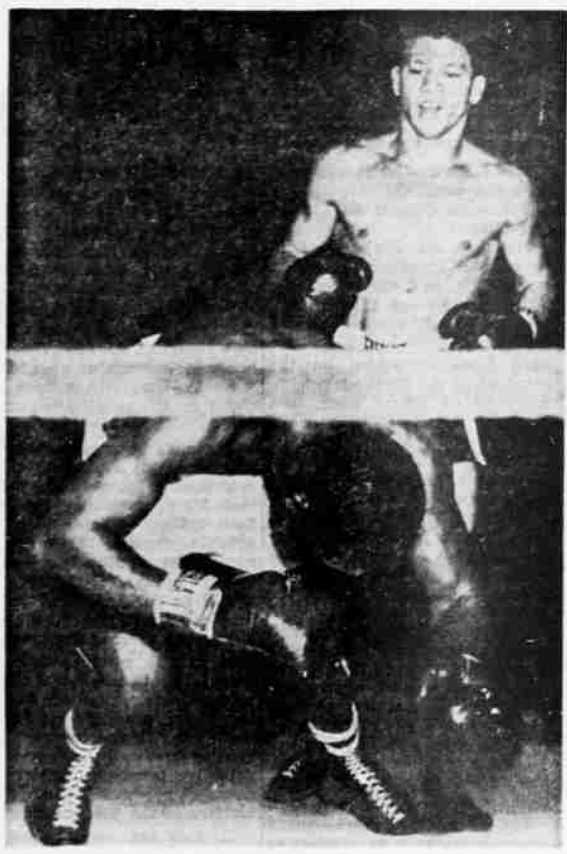

Bilko Needs Six Homers To Tie Lazzeri's PCL Mark

Los Angeles Angel slugger Steve Bilko, considered a virtual cinch to break the Pacific Coast league home run record at mid-season, now must hit almost two a day to tie the mark—and unless he snaps a late season homer slump, he'll finish no better than fourth highest in PCL history.

The brawny fence-buster hit his 54th round tripper Sunday, leaving him six short of the record 60 set by "poosh 'em up" Tony Lazzeri with Salt Lake 31 years ago.

With just four games to go, only a miracle finish would push him past the magic mark. Angels Nip Padres.

Someone else in the Angel pennant-winning machine has been there to take up the slack. Thursday night, as Bilko went hitless in four trips, it was Joe Hannah and Jim Bolger wield-

ing the big bats as the Angels whipped San Diego 4-3. In the battle for third place, Hollywood's Bob Barger tossed a five-hitter as the Stars beat Portland 6-1 and pulled a game in front of the fourth-place Beavers. Seattle dumped San Francisco 8-5 in the other game. Sacramento and Vancouver were not scheduled.

If Bilko can get two more homers in the remaining four games he'll finish third highest in PCL history. If he hits three more, he'll come in second only to Lazzeri.

Still ahead of him, besides Lazzeri, are Ike Boone, who hit 55 in 1929 with the Mission club of San Francisco, and Gene Lillard who socked 56 for the 1935 Angels.
