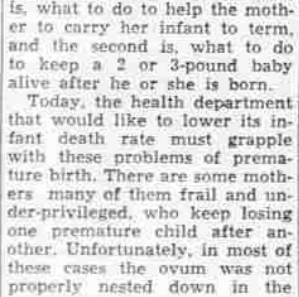
PREMATURE INFANTS

Recently, Dr. Ethel C. Dunham got out a second edition of her 459-page book of Premature Infants (Hoeber, N.Y.). The subject is tremendously important because, in the United States, about half of the total deaths that come in the first month of life, and more than a third of all deaths that occur in the first year of life, are due to the premature birth of the child. Premature birth is one of the 10 leading causes of death among the whole population.

Naturally, the first problem is, what to do to help the mother to carry her infant to term, and the second is, what to do to keep a 2 or 3-pound baby alive after he or she is born. Today, the health department that would like to lower its infant death rate must grapple with these problems of premature birth. There are some mothers many of them frail and underprivileged, who keep losing one premature child after another. Unfortunately, in most of these cases the ovum was not properly nested down in the

womb, or it did not develop properly from the start; hence the obstetrician cannot hope to accomplish much with the help of any drug. Oftentimes the premature infant is born with so many physical imperfections that it is impossible for him to live, or is a tragedy when he does survive for a few years. The older the mother is, between the ages of 43 and 50, the more likely she is to bear a child who cannot live.

One great difficulty with the premature infant is that its tissues are so delicate. They cannot stand up to the strains of life. Many premature children, also, have lungs which are so defective that they cannot properly aerate the blood. For a while, it was thought that the answer to many of the problems

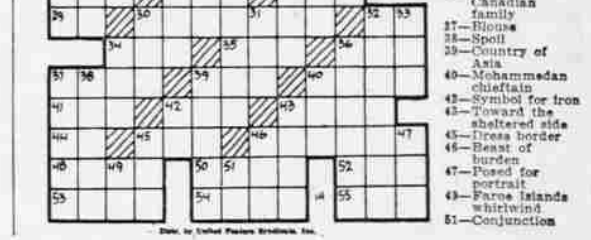
