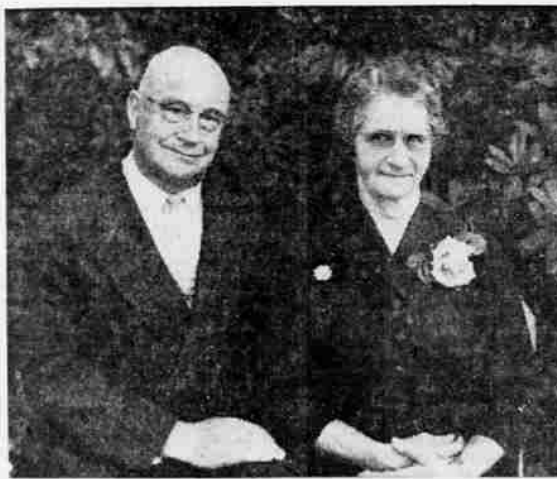

Apostolic Faith Minister To Leave for St. Louis

The Rev. C. W. Frost, minister of the Apostolic Faith church, 901 North Central ave., will leave soon for St. Louis, Mo., where he and his wife will do evangelistic work.

Mr. Frost came to Medford in 1917 and has carried on evan-

gelistic work in the valley and the mountains. For the past five years he has been leader of the "Drive-In Church" assisted by "nine gospel workers and musicians. This group traveled throughout the Northwest and as far south as Tehachapi, Calif.

Except for a few years spent at the headquarters of the Apostolic Faith in Portland, Mr. Frost has been with the Apostolic church here.

During the years the church building was built at Third ave. and Central, and has been enlarged several times. A 40-piece orchestra and 33-voice chorus has been organized. Six buses are used by the Sunday school to bring children from all directions, traveling 335 miles each Sunday.

The Rev. Loyce Carver of Los Angeles will be the new pastor at the Medford church.

Dedication Services Sunday At St. Mark's Episcopal

Dedication services for St. Mark's Episcopal Church school, recently completed, will be held on Sunday at 11 a.m. with the Right Reverend James W. F. Carman, bishop co-adjutor of Oregon, officiating.

The new \$113,000 building of steel, brick, and transite panel construction contains 20 large classrooms in addition to the new church offices.

The first part of the dedication service will be held in the church and will include shortened morning prayer and scripture reading by Jerome A. McDougall, general superintendent of the school. Music will include the St. Mark's choir under the direction of John Drysdale singing the anthem, "We Would Be Building," an introit, "The Lord's Prayer," and a petitionary solo, "Bless This House," to be sung by Arthur Lee Simpkins.

The dedication sermon will be delivered by the Rev. Mr. Carman. At the conclusion of the church service all will proceed to the site of the new building where the dedicatory exercises will take place.

Also to be dedicated will be a large mural exterior cross to the memory of the late Gary Townsend Kleiver, a senior acolyte and explorer scout of St. Mark's parish, who died last year. The cross is the gift of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward H. Kleiver of Medford. Also included in the service will be the immurement of appropriate documents in the west wall of the building.

At the close of the dedication service refreshments will be served in Guild hall. The new school will be open for inspection and for registration of junior

church school children from 9:30 to 10:45 a.m. Sunday and after the dedication through the afternoon.

From 10:45 a.m. until the conclusion of the dedicatory exercises, a nursery school for young children will be available in the Annex building at the rear of the new school.

All members and friends of St. Mark's are invited to attend the services.

Church Members In U.S. First Time Over 100,000,000

New York—For the first time in the nation's history church members in the United States number more than 100,000,000, the National Council of Church reported this week.

The latest annual compilation of the Yearbook of American Churches, to be published Sept. 15 by the National Council of Churches, shows there are now 100,162,529 church members of all faiths in the United States. In the previous year the total was 97,482,611.

"Continuing an upsurge that goes back to World War II, church membership gains in the past year again outstripped population gains. There are 2.8 per cent more church members as against 1.8 per cent more people," the council said.

"Of the 100,000,000 with religious affiliation," the report said, "58,448,000 are Protestant, 33,396,000 are Roman Catholic, and 5,500,000 are Jewish. In addition, there are 2,386,000 members of Eastern Orthodox churches in this country and informal estimates place the number of Moslems in the United States between 10,000 and 20,000."

"Translated into percentages," the report continues, "the grand total shows that 60.9 per cent of Americans belong to churches. By comparison, it was 57 per cent in 1950, 49 per cent in 1900."

Record Total
"To complete the membership picture, a record total of 38,921,033 Americans, mostly children and youths, are enrolled in Sunday or Sabbath schools, a gain of 3.4 per cent."

The number of local churches has grown to 305,449, an increase of 5,393.

Pastors with charges number 222,018, a gain of 8,051.

Per capita contributions to churches averaged \$48.61, a 7 per cent increase.

These are all good signs. But they are not conclusive."

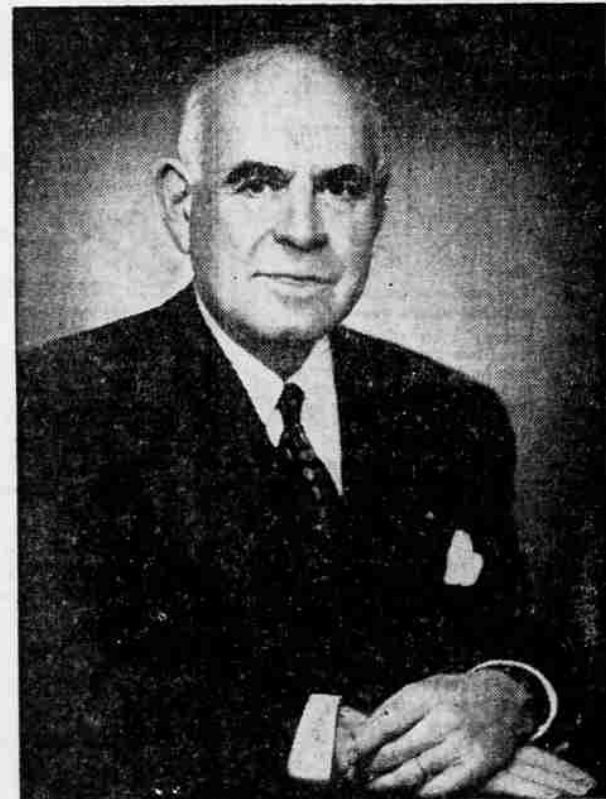
