

Tornado, Mustang Gridders In Tilt Here This Evening

Two football aggregations which bear watching this fall on the Oregon high school scene tangled this evening on the senior high stadium grass.

No league or district honors will be at stake when the Medford Black Tornado and the Milwaukie Mustang eleven's come together with an 8:15 p.m. kick-off. But the victor will pick up considerable prestige in the state.

It will be the second ruckus of the season for both contingents. Medford walloped Jefferson, the Portland Interscholastic league defender, 34 to 12 last week while Milwaukie was trimming Oregon City 13 to 8.

The Black Tornado is not anticipating such an easy time this week. Yet there's confidence that, if the club comes through with the same hard charging, sparkling play, it can come out in front again.

Milwaukie, tutored by Bob Misely, will bring a T formation on to the Medford turf. Mustang defenders in turn will face a versatile Medford T and single wing attack.

Lake Forest, Ill.—(U.P.)—Youth battles experience in pay-off semi-final clashes of the National Amateur golf tourney today with Jerry Magee against Charlie Koosis and Joe Campbell facing defending champion E. Harvie Ward.

Both Magee, 22, and Campbell, 20, were newcomers to the round of four of the annual simon-pure battle.

Koosis, while making his first appearance in the semi-finals, once was a professional, won the national collegiate title in 1936, twice played on the Walker cup team, and has qualified for this event 13 times.

Ward, 30, is trying to become the seventh player in history to win the aged tournament two years in a row.
