

Access Road Near Completion

The timber access road under construction in the Rogue River National Forest in Siskiyou County, Calif., is nearing completion, according to Daniel H. Lewis, resident engineer for the Bureau of Public Roads. The road is part of the bureau's Elliot Creek project.

Starting at Joe Bar and ending at Donomore fork, the 11½ miles will open up timber resources in the upper Applegate drainage area, as well as the old mining regions, Lewis said.

Evidences of mining activity and old mines, including the historic Daffodil and Pennsylvania mines, can still be seen, Lewis reported.

Since the road ends near Perks Pasture guard station, all timber must be hauled to the Oregon side to be milled, Lewis pointed out.

In cooperation with the forest service, the Bates Lumber company is financing the cost of construction. Supervising the project is the department of commerce, Bureau of Public Roads. Contractor is A. L. Harding, Inc., Stayton, Ore.

Oregon Green Fir Lumber Market Soft

The green fir lumber market in Oregon is still in a "soft" condition according to the latest issue of Random Lengths, a weekly lumber market report published in Eugene.

Random Lengths said buyers in potential consuming areas are withholding mill placement orders until convinced that prices will go no lower. The consensus of industry opinion is that price firming and volume increase in buying depend on happenings in green fir sawmills.

Plywood is holding to a basing price of \$72 per thousand board feet for quarter-inch air dried stock.

Memory Gardens Expansion Planned

William Ferris, manager of Memory Gardens Memorial Park, announced plans for an expansion program which will add two more acres to the project.

The park, located on Arnold lane west of Medford, was started last year and will eventually consist of 40 acres of garden style interment area.

The development announced today will be known as "The Garden Of The Apostles" and will feature a garden court surrounded by 11 mausoleum units. Each unit will commemorate one of the apostles with marble statuary denoting this fact, Ferris said. W. H. Seibert of Medford, architect for the project, has completed the initial drawings for the first unit in the new addition to be named in honor of the Apostle Matthew.

Ferris said that the development will be patterned after Forest Lawn and similar memorial parks. A corporation has been formed to provide endowed care for the area.

He noted that several thousand Rogue Valley residents are now participating in the development plan which calls for addition of completed areas as fast as funds are available. Ferris stated that crypts and family memorials will be offered in the "Garden Of The Apostles" area prior to completion of the overall project.

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
