Helping Mentally Retarded Children

At a recent convention in New York, Dr. Joseph Wortis, of Brooklyn, a child psychiatrist, commented on 4 different types of physical disorders which are associated with mental deficiencies. Today, some thing can be done for all of these four

troubles. There is cretinism, in which the child is short, chubby, round-faced, perhaps with puffy eyelids and a tongue too big for the mouth. This condition is due to a deficiency in the thyroid gland, and it can be greatly relieved by the giving of thyroid substance.

There is mental retardation due to a failure of the child's body to handle a substance called phenylpyruvic acid. By removing a substance in the diet from which the phenylpyruvic acid is formed, these children can be made somewhat brighter. Another rare mental disease is now known to be due to the failure of the body to handle sugar of milk, or galactose. When given a galactose-free diet, the children are better. Than there are the mental troubles due to an Rh incompatibility. These can be combated shortly after birth by replacing the child's harmful blood with good blood from some other person.

Speakers at the Congress emphasized the importance of team-work in caring for mentally sick children. The team should consist of a psychiatrist, a pediatrician (children's specialist), a neurologist (nervous specialist), an orthopedic surgeon (a bone and joint specialist), a physical therapist, a psychologist, a speech therapist, a school teacher, a social worker, and the parents.

Cheering to many parents will be the statement that they must not be blamed for the child's mental troubles as sometimes they are blamed today by psychiatric spinners of weird theories. Such psychiatrists often tell the parents that they willfully decided to hurt the child by building around him a bad environment, or loving him too much or too little, but able students of the subject have little patience with these psychoanalytic ideas.

Dr. Leo Kanner wisely asserted that physicians should be honest with the parents of these children, and should not keep lying to them just to soothe their feelings, and to put off the evil day when they must face the fact that their child is not mentally normal and never will be. The parents have a right to the best information that can be given them. They have a right to such information also, later when they ask if their child should ever marry and have children.

Commonly, the kindly doctor slides out of telling the parents the truth, but I cannot feel that it is honest or really kind to string them along, and to cause them to waste thousands of dollars on treatments which any physician could have told them would be futile. We doctors keep saying, "Have hope, have hope," and in this behavior we take pride. But as the experts now say, usually it would be much better to tell quickly the unpleasant truth. Why not stop the parents from wasting thousands of dollars traveling about the country. In most cases the expert can tell from one glance at the child that nothing can be done. He does not have to examine him!

Every parent with a mentally undeveloped child should read and re-read Mrs. Pearl Buck's

the man is working.

To illustrate, I just read that while performing an autopsy on a baboon which had died in a zoo, the pathologist found in the animal's arteries, narrowed segments with a hardening of the wall more like that seen in man than anything that has ever been found occurring spont-

aneously in the arteries of animals. My friends, the research workers who are now studying this problem in the Southwest Research Institute at San Antonio feel that a door has been opened to them which may now lead to a better understanding of the type of hardening of the arteries that occurs so commonly in men

and women. Now, the research workers are planning to start a colony of baboons on which they can carry out their important work.

Dr. Alvarez hopes his readers will understand that it would be impossible for him to answer requests for information or to attempt to diagnose by mail.
