

Arctic Cold Blast And Snow Remind That Fall Is Near

A cold blast of Arctic air covering the Great Lakes and a light snowfall in Northern Michigan were advance warnings today that autumn was almost here.

Weathermen said fall would officially arrive Saturday at 5:30 p.m. (PST).

A trace of snow fell at Houghton, Mich., where temperatures dropped into the 30s as cold air moved southward across the Great Lakes region. The season's first snow flurries also were reported at Wausau, Wis., and Traverse City, Mich.

Extends Into Texas

The sharp blast of cold air extended from the Lower Great Lakes area southward through the Northern Ohio Valley and into the northern portions of the Lower Mississippi valley and Texas. Movement of the cold air today was to be southeastward.

In the region of the Arctic air, early morning temperatures ranged from 10 to 25 degrees lower than Wednesday, and had dropped into the upper 20s in some sections of the Upper Great Lakes.

At Chicago Wednesday, the mercury strained to reach 59 degrees, the lowest reading for a Sept. 19 since 1938.

Showers Expected

Scattered showers were expected from the Appalachians eastward to the Atlantic Coast with the further movement of the chilly air. A few snow flurries were forecast for tonight in the higher elevations of Northern New England.

Meanwhile, fair weather was to prevail west of the Appalachians to the Rockies, with a slight warming over the Northern Plains. Fair skies were predicted for the Southern Rockies westward to the Pacific while scattered showers wet the Pacific Northwest.

Crossbow Used In Mystery Assault

East Los Angeles—UPI—The crossbow, a weapon out of the past, was used Wednesday night by a mysterious assailant who wounded liquor store clerk William E. Allen, 20.

A 16-inch arrow with a 2½ inch wide tip was fired through the back entrance of the store and struck Allen below his right shoulder blade, puncturing a lung. The victim, found lying on the floor, was taken to Hollywood hospital where he was given a blood transfusion.

Sheriff's officers found the crossbow, cocked and loaded, behind a hedge in the neighborhood. A box containing four feathered, steel-tipped arrows was found with the weapon.

The crossbow was described by an officer as a steel bow on a wooden stock, a type preferred by archery hunters.

The basic weapon was used primarily in medieval times.

Two Men Rescued From Raft in Ocean

Newport, Ore.—UPI—Two men who had to abandon their tuna boat when it sank were rescued from their life raft today by the fishing vessel Santiam.

The Santiam radioed the Coast Guard at 7:25 a.m. that it had picked up the two men and was proceeding to Newport. No names were reported.

The two fishermen aboard the 45-foot vessel Al Jr., radioed at 3 a.m. their vessel was sinking and they were abandoning ship. The Al Jr. at that time was about 60 miles west by northwest of this coastal town.

It was not known what caused the tuna boat to sink.

Churchill's Son Ends Career as 'Quiz Kid'
