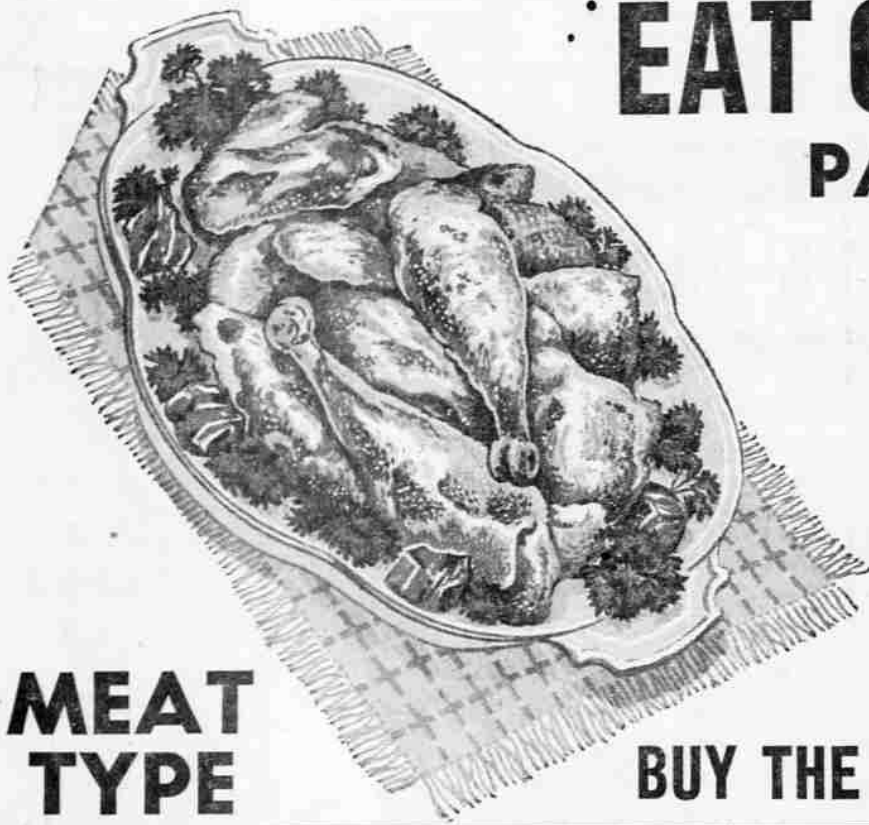

Optometrists Meet At Country Club

A report on recent visual screening clinics conducted by Lions clubs in the northwest was given at a meeting of optometrists from Medford, Ashland, and Grants Pass at a meeting of the Southern Oregon Optometric Society at the Rogue Valley Country club recently.

Dr. Tom Anderson, chairman of the society, commended work of the Medford and Grants Pass Lions clubs and Lady Lions in conducting the clinics.

He noted that through club efforts the public gains a better understanding of visual problems of students. The report included notice of a visual screening clinic which will be conducted by the Lions club of Rogue River in the near future.

The next study meeting of the society will be held Oct. 2 with the next regular meeting of the society scheduled Oct. 16. Both meetings will be held in Grants Pass.

Oregon Wildlife Yield Estimated

Portland - (UPI) - The State Game Commission estimated today that hunters and fishermen last year harvested \$9 million worth of "meat in the pot" from Oregon wildlife resources.

The figures were reached from hunter kill records and angler punch cards. They showed that deer provided the most meat poundage, followed by salmon and steelhead, elk, ducks, pheasants and geese.

The commission said the figure was a conservative one, based on comparisons with the cost of beef, ducks, chickens, and salmon in the retail markets. And it represented only the meat value of the wildlife harvested on which records are kept. Poundage of trout or game fish other than salmon and steelhead are not recorded.

Holt's Daughters Escorting Orphans

Seoul, Korea - (UPI) - Two daughters of Oregon farmer Harry Holt, self-appointed adoption agent of Korean-American orphans, left for the United States today escorting 25 children to their new American homes.

Wanda, 21, and Barbara, 17, have been in the Republic of Korea for the past month looking after the mixed blood orphans who were selected for adoption by American families.

The Holt sisters flew to America with 12 boys and 13 girls, all under 10.

Holt started his "adoption agency" a year ago by adopting eight Korean-American children for himself. Ninety Korean-American babies have already been sent to American families through Holt's "proxy adoption" program.

Dr. William C. Stram To Open Offices Here
