

Weddings and Fashions



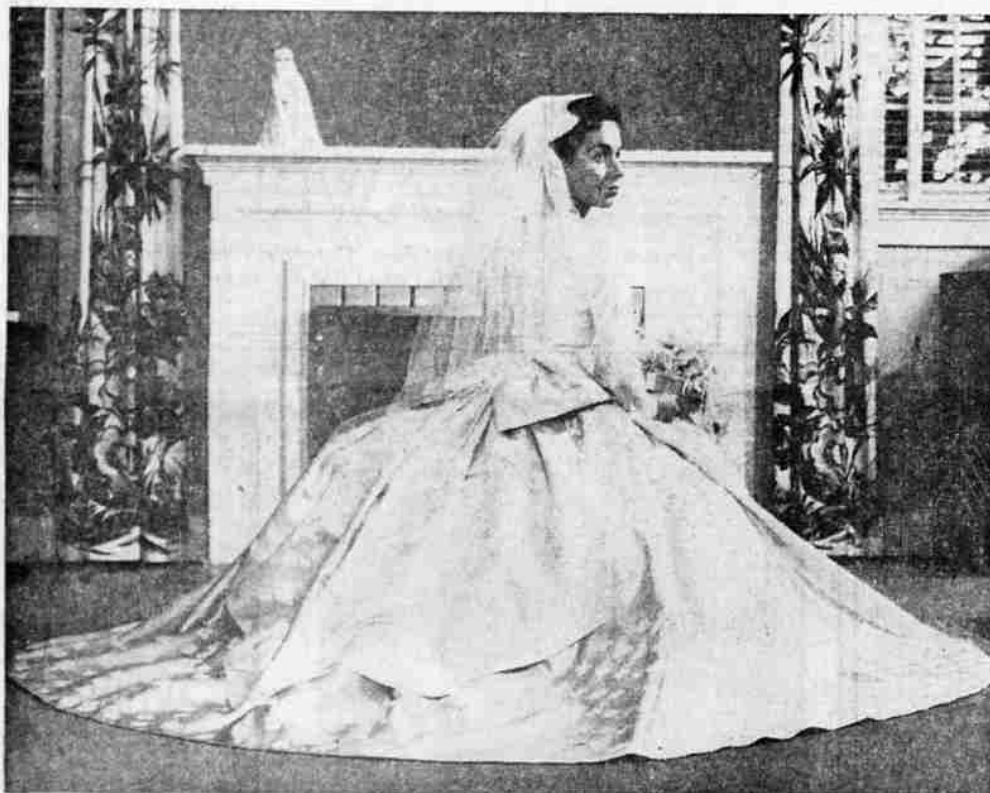
