Summer Constellations Are Moving Toward Western Sky

Now that "the frost is on the pumpkin" and chill September mornings bespeak the arrival of autumn, let us "pause in our day's occupation" for a general review of our starry friends in the heavens.

As the fall months roll by new star groups rising in the east will gradually replace the constellations that were prominent during the weeks of summer but are now drawing closer to the western horizon; soon to disappear from the night sky.

Northwestern Horizon
 Bootes, the Plowman, often called The Kite because of its shape, has faithfully driven his plow across the summer sky and is now to be found low on the northwestern horizon. Due to the haze near the surface of the earth it may be possible to see only the beautiful orange-yellow, first magnitude star, Arcturus, located at the bottom of The Kite. Its rapid scintillations make it a "thing of beauty" in the early evening.

During the month of October, Bootes will disappear beneath the western horizon.

Following Bootes is Corona Borealis or the Northern Crown. During the early part of November this star picture will sink from view in the west.

Hercules, Hero of Many Adventures, comes next in this westward march of constellations and will no longer be visible after the middle of November.

Scorpio Travels

The brilliant Scorpion low in the southern heavens has traveled far to the southwest. It will soon be impossible to see this brightest of summer constellations.

Shortly after Scorpio has sunk from view, Sagittarius the Archer, low in the southern Milky Way will follow suit.

What causes the stars to slip westward each day and finally disappear beneath the western horizon? This is due entirely to movements of the earth. We have all noticed that stars which rise in the east in the evening apparently travel across the sky during the night and may be observed in the west before sunrise.

However, the earth was doing the moving; not the stars. As our planet rotates on its axis it turns from west to east. This causes the sun and stars to appear to be traveling from the east to the west. (Haven't you noticed how fast the trees go down in the opposite direction from which you are driving your car?)

Another Movement

The earth has a second important movement. It makes one trip around the sun each year. This annual journey causes the stars to become visible four minutes earlier each evening and

also to rise four minutes higher in the sky each night. Four minutes each day add up to two hours in a month. Thus a star that rose at 10 p.m. at the first of one month would rise at 8 p.m. on the first of the following month.

How does a star "rise four minutes higher each night?" Let us picture the sky as a huge arch extending from the eastern to the western horizon, and forming a half circle. Then think of this arch as representing 12 hours or one half turn of the earth on its axis. Twelve hours equals 720 minutes.

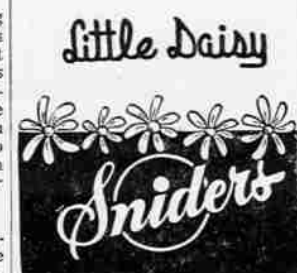
If we could mark our celestial arch in minutes, the number one would be on the eastern horizon and the 720 on the western horizon. On the meridian (an imaginary line extending through the center of the sky from north to south) would be placed the number 360.

A star rising in the east would appear each night to be four minutes higher on this celestial arch. For example, Hercules is visible on the eastern horizon about April 1 at 10 p.m. By July 1 at 10 p.m. this star group is on the meridian. Three
