The calm first-grader allowed the reptiles to twine around his neck and arms. And after the initial shock, the teacher, Miss Nancy Frye, encouraged young Jonathan to tell his classmates about the snakes.

"After the children saw he wasn't afraid of them, they soon were handling them like veterans," she said. "Jonathan showed them that a lot of tales about snakes—such as being slimy—are just falacies."

The boy is the son of a Noble Foundation scientist, Dr. Elias Cohen. Dr. Cohen said Jonathan began playing with non-poisonous snakes when he was three and now goes on field trips to hunt them.
