Rail Shares Score Small Average Gain

New York — (U.P.) — Stocks rallied today after another decline had carried the list to a new low since June 8.

Railroad shares were able to score a small average gain. Industrials made up the major portion of a loss of around five points in their average. Steels moved higher under the lead of Bethlehem. Douglas and Chance Vought, each up more than a point, led the aircrafts higher.

Sales today were about 2,370,000 shares compared with 2,100,000 shares Tuesday.

Superintendents Hold Meeting Today
The Jackson County Superintendents' association held its first meeting of the year at 2 p.m. today in the county school superintendent's office, according to Alf Mekvold, superintendent of county schools.

Purpose of the meeting was to elect officers, Mekvold said, and to plan educational legislation to be submitted to the state legislature when it convenes this winter.

A regional meeting of school superintendents of four counties, school administrators and boards will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow in the old circuit court in the county courthouse.

Mekvold said the purpose of the meeting is for educators and administrators to clarify among themselves the changes in law regarding federal funds for education and conditions under which districts can qualify for funds and procedure of making out applications.

Tomorrow beginning at 8:30 a.m. the county textbook committee will meet to consider approving books for high school and grade school use. The grade school committee, of which Chester Lind is chairman, of Griffin creek school, will meet at the county courthouse and the high school committee, of which Clair Gurwell, English teacher at Medford high school is chairman, will meet at Medford High school.

Purpose of the committees are to advise the state textbook committee on selection of textbooks.
