Swift Plant Remains Closed at Portland

Portland — (U.P.) — The large Swift and Co., meat packing plant in north Portland remained idle today as pickets continued their march in front of plant gates and county police stood by should any sign of violence break out.

No violence has been reported in the strike thus far but three attempts by the company to get trucks through the gates of the plant have been unsuccessful as pickets put up human barriers to the vehicles.

Three attempts yesterday to get trucks inside the struck plant met with failure when drivers refused to cross the human barriers in front of them.

Sheriff Terry D. Shruok took command of the detachment of county officers at the scene when officials became fearful that violence might develop.

Mrs. Roosevelt Due in Portland; Morse Has Harsh Words for Coon

Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt was scheduled to appear in Portland tonight at a \$10 per plate Democratic dinner. Robert Holmes, Democratic nominee for governor, will act as master of ceremonies and Sen. Wayne Morse will introduce Mrs. Roosevelt.

Douglas McKay, GOP senatorial candidate, carried the brunt of Republican campaigning in the state yesterday. In a television appearance last night the former interior secretary lauded President Eisenhower's "firm and determined purpose for peace" as the world's greatest hope that war can be avoided in the Suez crisis.

Morse Said Bitter Fox

McKay took the opportunity to mention his opponent, Morse, and labeled him as "the bitter fox and the greatest obstructionist of the Eisenhower program for world peace."

Sen. Morse had harsh words for Rep. Sam Coon, Republican seeking reelection in the state's second district yesterday. Speaking at Milton-Freewater, Morse charged Coon with "striving to cover up for the failure of the Eisenhower administration to provide Oregon and Washington orchardists with the disaster relief to which they are entitled."

Earlier in the day Morse had labeled Coon as a "stooge for the Idaho Power company" in a Pendleton address.

Meanwhile, Coon informed radio station KUMA in Pendleton that he would be unable to accept an invitation to debate his opponent, Al Ullman, over the station's facilities. Coon said his campaign commitments would prevent him from working the proposed debates into his schedule.

Neuberger Campaigns

Sen. Richard L. Neuberger carried his electioneering in behalf of Morse and the Democratic slate of candidates into Coos county yesterday. He charged that McKay has revealed that he would be the puppet for lobbyists and pressure groups and described Sen. Morse as "a great senator and

a fighter for humanitarian causes."

Speaking at Beaverton last night, Holmes charged that Republican candidates are using all the devices known to man "to avoid talking about issues."

Gov. Elmo Smith carried his bid for return to the governor's office to Portland last night. In a speech at the Women's auditorium he said he was going to discuss "issues—not personalities" and added that Oregon voters would know where he stands on every important issue of the day.

Propaganda Charged

Monroe Sweetland, Democratic nominee for secretary of state, carried his campaign to Yamhill county yesterday, speaking at Willamina and Sheridan. His opponent, Mark Hatfield, campaigned in Milton-Freewater yesterday and criticized some obviously partisan efforts to get out the vote and "campaigning by propaganda."

State Sen. Carl Francis of Day-

ton, Republican candidate for attorney general, carried his campaign into Portland yesterday with the 35-piece Dayton high school band furnishing not only music but some of the political talk. The caravan stopped for reinforcements at Newberg — where Mayor George Layman provided a police escort—and then moved into Portland. After disbanding in the Parkrose area, the high school band players and other supporters of Francis went from door to door urging his election.

ATTACK ON ELBA

Island of Elba, Italy — (U.P.) — Officials mapped battle plans today to destroy an army attacking the villa where Napoleon Bonaparte lived when he was exiled here in 1814. Prof. Antonio Melis, superintendent of historic property of Florence, said he was prepared to exterminate an army of termites which is devouring the furniture of the Napoleonic museum.

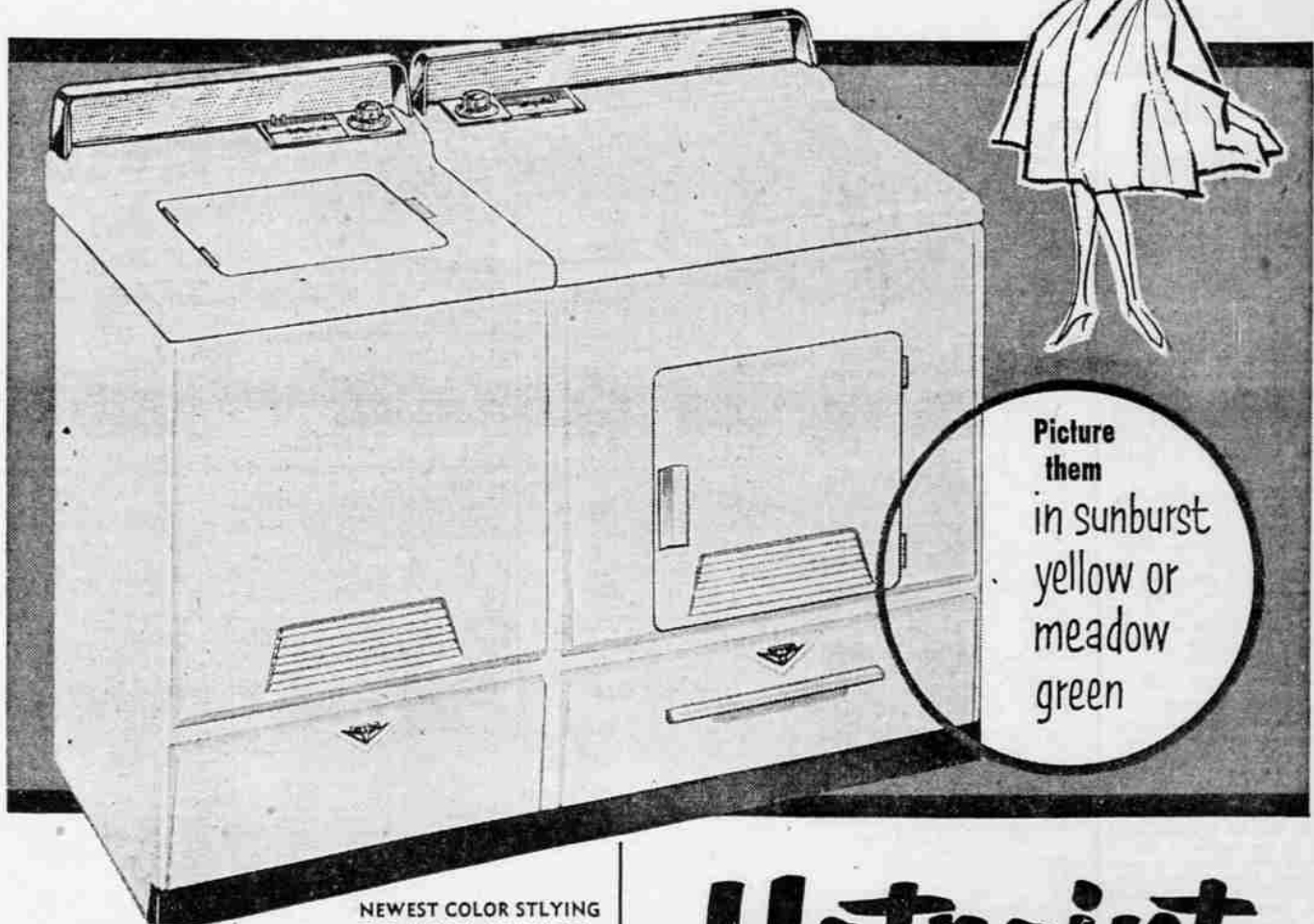
