Prospects Generally Good For Opening of Deer Season in State

Portland —(U.P.)— The State Game Commission said today that prospects for opening of deer hunting season in Oregon Saturday are generally good throughout the state.

Some 250,000 nimrods are expected to hunt deer in Oregon this year. A record harvest of more than 134,000 deer was taken last season and the commission said another "banner" year was in prospect.

The commission's report:

SOUTHWEST: The outlook in Douglas county is very good. The pigeon season ends September 30th, and there are no concentrations of pigeons. Deer hunting prospects for Coos and Curry counties appear good for the opening week end. Best bet will be in the open country and in recently logged-over lands.

Continued dry weather would make hunting more difficult. Some rains have fallen in the Cascade area. Soda mountain, and north, and this area should be best for deer hunting.

CENTRAL: Prospects in the Mount Hood national forest are good. The deer still remain at the higher elevations and are moving mostly at night. Ground conditions will be dry unless a rain comes before the week end. Hunting conditions in central Oregon are not very good due to dry weather this past month. Distribution of deer is not favorable for the best hunting

as the bulk of these animals appear to have moved into the country. There are lots of deer present under these conditions in the high Cascades and in the Paulina mountains. Deer in the Goshute forest are also staying mostly on the high north slope thickets and will be difficult to find. Some deer have begun moving on to irrigated fields in this area but are not as numerous as in previous years.

NORTHEAST: Deer appear to be quite plentiful in all localities in northeast Oregon and in good condition. All roads are good, but the woods are extremely dry, and fire hazards exist. Some of the more productive areas will be Chainmail and Innaha in Walla Walla county; Mt. Harris, Tolocasset, Minam river, and upper Cathlamet creek in Union county; Kealing and Sumner areas in Baker county; the breaks of the John Day river, Cherry creek, Twickenham, and north Okechons in Wheeler county; the foothills area out of Heppner, upper Wilcox creek, Riba creek, Rock creek, the best hunting on these lands. Deer hunting in the south Willamette area should be best at lower elevations. Roads are in good condition.

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Pros Expected To Throw Fewer Passes This Year

The National Football league begins its 37th season Sunday and fans can expect the pro circuit's better clubs to put plenty of emphasis on ball carriers and defense in 1956.

The top teams still will be those with the best passers, but they'll probably make fewer throws.

Defensive tactics against passes have been perfected to the point that the ball carrier again has become a vital asset to the pro team with championship ambitions.

Also, the league's 12 clubs have become so evenly matched physically that often the only differences lie in psychological weapons. The most potent of these is the intercepted pass. Skilled defensive backs such as Will Sherman of the Los Angeles Rams, Jack Christiansen of the Detroit Lions and Don Paul of the Cleveland Browns have turned the forward pass into a first-class boomerang.
