The Medical Roundup

PSORIASIS

Hundreds of persons ask me what to do for psoriasis. This is a hereditary and often life-long disease of the skin. Red patches covered with little silvery scales appear often on the outside of the elbows and knees, or on the back of the neck or on the scalp. For a while, the disease may almost go away, and then it may come back in an aggravated form. Often a skin specialist can give much relief with salves and perhaps ultraviolet radiation; but later, when the disease flares again, these measures may no longer work well. Then the unhappy skin specialist will have to try something else.

In some cases the disease flares up with emotional strain. I remember one of my patients, a tense, nervous woman, whose skin cleared in a few days when she started taking a Rauwolfia drug.

One miserable feature about psoriasis is that it can affect the

joint, to produce an arthritis. It can also affect the nails on the fingers and toes. I know of no constantly successful treatment.

A LUMP IN THE GROIN

Quite a few persons ask me what to do about a lump in the groin. Obviously, the first thing to do is to get a diagnosis. If the thing is a rupture, the commonest danger is that it might come out and get caught. In that case, the person might lose his life unless he could get a surgeon to operate within an hour or two. Later, the bowel dies, and then peritonitis comes.

But the lump might be a cancerous growth and then the man's life will depend on having the thing removed quickly. Or if the man has a badly infected ulcer around an ankle, the lump in his groin may be just an enlarged lymph node. In that case the patient should see a physician and ask him to heal the ulcer.

What bothers me is that persons will let lumps go—sometimes for months—without finding out what they are. Often, then, when they do find out, it is too late to do anything. Cancer is then scattered through the body, and for this there is rarely any help.

Hollywood—U.P.—"In all the United States only a handful of young unknowns have the talent play Joan of Arc."

Potential Miscalculation

"I have seen some," he said, "I have great confidence will come through in a screen test, but I miscalculated the number I could find to test." Preminger whispered while we watched girl after girl read the same speech from the Shaw play. "I thought I could find at least 50. But I won't test that many."

"At first I was discouraged. Then I realized that if looking for an unknown were so easy, a star would be easier to find. I'm looking for a girl like Jennifer Jones when she played 'Song of Bernadette' or Audrey Hepburn when she did 'Gigi.' They both were unknowns."

Watching an audition is an unhappy task. On the stage were thin, blonde, brunette, wearing pedal pushers or cocktail dresses, most playing Joan in their bare feet.

One can't help but suffer for each aspirant. When Preminger cut short the unsuccessful auditions with a "Thank you very much," some girls looked dejected, others calm, many angry. During two hours of watching I saw only one girl who had enough of a spark to cause Preminger to ask her for a further audition.

"If I had a studio I'd put many of these girls under contract for other roles," Preminger said.
