The high-riding Milwaukee Braves can clinch at least a tie for the National League pennant tonight, if a couple of Dodger-killers named Bob Buhl and Bob Friend can just drive two more nails in Brooklyn's coffin.

All it would take would be for bushy-browed Buhl of the Braves to beat the St. Louis Car-

dinals at St. Louis while pudgy-cheeked Friend of the Pittsburgh Pirates beats the Dodgers in Brooklyn.

The combination of events would put Milwaukee two full games ahead of Brooklyn with only two games left to go. Even if the Braves lost their remaining two games, the best Brooklyn could do would be tie for the flag and force a playoff starting Monday.

Tonight could turn out much differently, however—it could see the Dodgers regain a tie with Milwaukee for first place in skinning Roger Craig, winless since Aug. 22, can beat Friend while Tom Poholsky of the Cardinals outpitches Buhl for his third win over Milwaukee this year.

Redleg Chances Slight

If the Braves and Dodgers both win—Milwaukee would remain one game ahead and be one day nearer the finish line. The only result would be to wipe out the last mathematical hope of the third-place Cincinnati Redlegs. If the Braves and Dodgers both lose—the Braves still would be a game ahead and the Dodgers would have muffed a golden opportunity.

There were no games Thursday, a "traveling day" in the schedule.

Buhl, the man who whipped Brooklyn eight times this year, will be seeking his 19th win of the year tonight while Friend, with a 4-1 edge over Brooklyn, will be shooting for his 18th.

Braves' skipper Fred Haney says Lefty Warren Spahn will face St. Louis Saturday but he hasn't made up his mind about a hurler for Sunday's finale.

Eagles Win 67-7 Over Rogue River

Eagle Point—Eagle Point high, with its big, rugged line opening the way for fancy broken field runners Jack Greb and Errol Tresham, clawed and shredded Rogue River 67 to 7 here last night in a non-league football game.

Greb and Tresham were the big offensive guns. Greb made long dashes for four touchdowns and passed to Tresham for another. Tresham scored twice on runs and threw two TD passes.

The Eagles erupted for a counter the first time they got their hands on the ball. Tresham burst into the secondary and ran 66 yards to the goal. Rogue River still threatened to make a game of it at that stage. Lawrence Wagner and Bob Wilson were thrower and receiver on a 62-yard pass play which put the ball on the Eagle half-yard spot. Fred Bond went over for the touchdown and Fred Hopper's conversion boot was good to tie up the game at 7-all.

Then Eagle Point tallied on a 44-yard run by Greb for a 13 to 7 first quarter count. Three touchdowns in the second quarter took the count to 34 to 7 by halftime. The Greb to Tresham TD pass went for 39 yards and Greb made 36 and 56 scampers to the goal.

Greb ran 48 yards and Bill McClure went nine yards for third period TDs that made it 46 to 7. Tresham went 10 yards in the last quarter and heaved to Ralph McClure and Bill McClure on nine and 23 yard touchdowns plays.

Tresham ran three conversions and Greb ran one and passed to Wayne Christian for the other. Eagle Point picked up two points on a safety when Mike Kaizer tackled Paul Archer of Rogue River in the Chieftain end zone.

Rogue River netted only 37 yards on the ground in the first half and was thrown for minus 18 in the second for a net of 19 from rushing. The Chiefs picked up 80 yards through the air but three pass completions lost a total of 16 yards for a net gain throwing of 64.

Tresham ran 42 yards to the goal on one EP play but a penalty nullified the score.

Eagle Point led in first downs 11 to four.

Intersectional Conflicts Top Saturday's Grid Menu

South Carolina-Miami and Southern California-Oregon State help kick off a big week end of college football tonight in the two top attractions on a sparse Friday program.

Despite South Carolina's shocking, 7-0 upset of highly regarded Duke last week end, Andy Gustafson's Miami Hurricanes are rated a one to three touchdown pick in the Orange Bowl. A crowd in excess of 45,000 is expected.

Southern California's Trojans, who whipped Texas, 44-20, in an intersectional game last Saturday, are a whopping 19-point pick over Oregon State, 19-13 winner over a fumbling Missouri team.

Intersectional games top Saturday's program with teams from all sections of the country swinging into action.

UCLA Is Underdog

In the more important invasions UCLA is a 13-point underdog to Michigan at Ann Arbor, Mich. Washington is a one touchdown pick over Minnesota at Seattle, Wash., Michigan State is a seven-point favorite to down Stanford at Palo Alto, Calif., Illinois is the 13-point choice over California at Champaign, Ill., and Oklahoma, the 1955 National champion, is favored by 27 points over invading North

Wake Forest, Mississippi is rated nine points better than Kentucky, while Auburn and Tennessee are rated even, and Florida gets the edge over Clemson.

In the Southwest and Midlands, Texas A&M gets the nod over Louisiana State, Texas is the pick over Tulane, Baylor is a slight favorite over Texas Tech in the Southwest's regionally telecast game. Houston is a hairline choice to vanquish Mississippi State and Wyoming's Cowboys are favored by three points over Denver.
