M. L. Applegate Dies Enroute to Southern Oregon

Ashland — Moray Lindsay Applegate, 80, a descendant of the pioneer Applegate family who helped settle southern Oregon, died Saturday during a trip to southern Oregon from Mexico.

He was born Aug. 6, 1876, in Dairying, Klamath county, the son of Capt. and Mrs. Ivan D. Applegate. He graduated from Monmouth normal school and entered the University of Oregon.

When war broke out between Spain and the United States during his junior year at the university, Mr. Applegate enlisted in the Army and was sent to the Philippine Islands. After returning to the United States, he re-entered the university and received his degree.

Returns to Philippines
After graduation, he returned to the Philippines and became assistant superintendent of schools. He was later chosen by the government to collect island specimens for the St. Louis exposition.

He returned to Oregon, then went to Mexico as manager of a hacienda. He was married there to Pastora Perez. They had two sons, Bernard and Richard.

At the outbreak of the Mexican revolution, he and his family escaped by boat from Mazatlan and went to Los Angeles. They made their home there for several years and his daughter, Alicia, was born. After the death of his wife, he returned to Mexico. He worked at Acapulco, recovering titles to lands confiscated by the government during the revolution.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. Alicia Hardy, Ashland; two sons, Bernard and Richard; two sisters, Mrs. Alice A. Pell of Ashland, and Mrs. Lena Lee Smith, Klamath Falls. Services were held Monday in Los Angeles.
