Three Types of Engines Seen For Future Vehicles

The first automobile manufacturer to produce a workable powerful and economical successor to the present internal-combustion gasoline engine may put his competitors in the shade, according to editors of Changing Times, The Kiplinger Magazine. Three types of engines may fill the bill: the gas-turbine engine, the free-piston engine and the fuel-injection engine. Only the latter type can claim any relationship to engines now in use. Luxury cars, such as Continentals and Cadillacs, may be equipped with it next year. A refinement of the motor in your present car, it has no carburetor; the fuel is sprayed directly into the cylinders. The result is fuel economy, improved acceleration and smoother operation. Experimentation with the gas turbine has been extensive, but you won't see it in cars for at least another five years. It requires only one-fifth the number of parts in a piston engine and weighs a third as much. Needs only one spark plug, gets along without a radiator or conventional cooling system and uses a cheap fuel. At present, the cost of producing the motors is prohibitive since fantastically expensive metals are needed to sustain the 1,600-degree heat created. The free-piston engine has successfully operated with cheap fuels, including peanut oil. It needs even fewer parts than a gas-turbine engine and is almost vibration-free. And it can be made of conventional metals, since it does not work up excessive heat. But it still has lots of bugs in it. What about atomic-powered engines? Scientists brush off any suggestions that atomic-powered cars are just over the horizon. They are not even sure such cars are possible. It's hard enough, they say, to harness atoms for locomotives, airplanes and steamships.

Increased Salaries Seen For Engineers

Chicago—(U.P.)—Starting salaries for engineers continue to climb, according to the Illinois Institute of Technology. The institute said salaries received by its 1956 graduates hit an all-time high. "Starting salaries are still spiraling," said placement director Earl C. Kubick. "This year's engineering graduates are earning an average of \$391 per month as compared with the 1955 average of \$383." Kubick said the average starting salary has increased every year since 1938, when the school began keeping records. Since 1949, when the average was \$282, it has risen more than \$100. Electrical engineers receive the highest salaries, \$461 per month compared with \$416 in 1955. Chemical engineering starting salaries rose from \$365 in 1955 to \$424 this year and civil engineering salaries rose from \$380 to \$434 in 1956. But the most complaint about rust prevention are municipal, state, and federal governments, the foundation said.

Rust Costs Americans About \$36 Annually, Study Shows

Chicago—(U.P.)—Rust costs the average American about \$36 a year, and the nation as a whole a whopping \$6 billion, a study shows. This is approximately seven times greater than the nation's annual fire loss, and about eight times greater than property damage from automobile accidents. The study was made by the Foundation for Management Research and the Rust-Oleum Corp. It showed that rust loss, increasing by leaps and bounds in recent years, has been boosted greatly by the increased use of farm machinery. The latest figures showed that in 1954, farmers paid \$2.6 billion for motor vehicles, machinery and other equipment. Depreciation on the equipment was about 40 per cent, or \$500 million, for the first year. The research foundation said rust was mainly responsible. Home Owners Too It said leaving farm machinery in the open, without protective coatings, ruins it faster than actual use. But the study showed that complacent home owners have their problems, too. The use of metals in and around the home in the last 10 years has increased 27 per cent, the report said. It said the trend can be seen in metal storm and screen sash, windows, gutters, ornamental iron, lawn furniture, gardening equipment and the like. Cleveland, Tenn.—(U.P.)—William Dooley hasn't missed a Sunday School class in 35 years, and he's not about to start skipping classes now. One Sunday morning recently, Dooley became ill and just didn't feel up to going to the First Methodist Church, where his pride and joy is the "Live Wire" class. If Dooley couldn't come to church, his Sunday School class decided to go to him. T. C. Bowler, city school superintendent, and 30 other members held their weekly session in Dooley's home.

Advantage of Fat Is Ability to Float

Chicago—(U.P.)—"The only advantage an overweight person has is his ability to float," Dr. Waldo Getting told the annual summer conference of the National Dairy Council. "Our overweight citizens are our greatest nutritional failures," said the doctor. "The overweight adult, especially over 43, is more likely to develop high blood pressure, heart disease, kidney disease and some types of cancer. The prevention of obesity should be the prime objective of nutritionists." Getting is a professor of public health practice at the University of Michigan.

Production of Meats Increases in 4 Years

Chicago—(U.P.)—The production of all meats jumped from 19,900,000,000 pounds in 1951 to almost 27,000,000,000 last year, according to the National Live Stock and Meat Board. Output this year probably will hit 27.7 billion pounds, with the increase divided equally between beef and pork and with veal and lamb remaining at 1955 levels. In the early 1920s, meat animals provided 24 per cent of all cash receipts from farming, the board said. In recent years they have accounted for almost 30 per cent. The board attributed the increase in part to strong consumer demand for meat, stemming from high employment and high income.

Ithaca, N.Y.—(U.P.)—When it comes to stresses and strains, the turkey has it all over fussy humans. Prof. M. L. Scott, of Cornell University, said frustrations may drive a human to vitamins and black coffee. But he added, turkeys wind up with curled tongues, leg weakness, loose gizzard linings, and even die.
