4 Seniors of UCLA To See First Duty

Eugene — (U.P.) — Coach Len Casanova of Oregon's dashing Ducks said today he wasn't surprised that UCLA planned to use four starting seniors against his team in Los Angeles Friday night in the Bruin's first 1956 Pacific Coast conference football game.

"We figured they'd be gunning for us," Casanova said, "but we're not going down there to roll over."

UCLA said that four seniors would see their first 1956 action Friday night against Oregon. They include speedy back Chuck Hollaway, end Pete O'Garro, tackle Preston Dills, and guard and Captain Don Birren.

The four were expected to be starters all season until the PCC cracked down and ruled that seniors at UCLA could play in only five consecutive games this year.

Casanova, whose speedy Webfoots are unbeaten in two games and are ranked 22nd nationally in the United Press coaches' poll, was asked if he thought Oregon could cope with the stronger Bruins.

"I think we can," he said. Although UCLA, clobbered by Michigan last week, is unranked nationally, it is rated a slight favorite over Oregon Friday night.

UO Gridders Leading Loop Statistics

Los Angeles — (U.P.) — Oregon dominated Pacific Coast conference team statistics in the school's first two games, the PCC commissioner's office revealed today.

The Ducks have given up only 77 yards a game rushing and 58 yards passing for a 135-yard total defense. UCLA ranked second in defense with a 252-3/4 yard total.

Washington, however, leads the PCC in total offense with a game average of 459.5 yards to Oregon's 447.5. Oregon boasts the leading rushing mark of 357 yards to Washington's 332.5. The Ducks also turned in the best punt return average of 14.4 yards. Southern California leads in punts with a 42.8 average.

Washington State has the best passing game, averaging 239.5 yards. Southern California leads in pass interceptions with five.

In individual statistics, Southern California fullback C. R. Roberts leads in the rushing department. He netted 284 yards in his first two games for a 12.3 average carry. John Brodie of Stanford took passing honors by completing 27 passes in 43 attempts for 62.8 per cent and 279 yards.

Roberts also leads in total offense with his 284 yard rushing mark. Brodie was second with 280 and the Trojans' Jon Arnett was third with 258 yards.

Arnett also was the leading scorer with 22 points. Norm Becker of California was the leading pass receiver with nine catches for 131 yards.

Fire Burns Press Box At Comiskey

Chicago — (U.P.) — Authorities today investigated the possibility of arson in a spectacular \$100,000 fire at Comiskey park that roared through a half-block section of the second deck stands and destroyed the press box.

Fire Lt. Walter Reilly, 47, collapsed on the roof of the stands while fighting the extra-alarm blaze late Tuesday. Flames shot as high as 40 feet above the stands and were visible from the Loop.

Deputy Fire Marshal Frank Thielmann said the blaze started in the press box at the park, home of the Chicago White Sox baseball team and the Chicago Cardinals professional football team. The Cardinals were working out on the field at the time.

A White Sox official estimated damage at about \$100,000. He said the press, radio and television booths, the main concession stand, washrooms and stairways in the area would have to be rebuilt.

Ed Short, the White Sox publicity man, said he doubted whether the press box and radio and television booths could be rebuilt in time for Sunday's football game between the Cardinals and the New York Giants.

Not True Bill Returned In Pendleton Death Case

Pendleton — (U.P.) — The Umatilla county grand jury yesterday returned a not true bill in the second degree murder charge against Hollis C. Doe, 30-year-old Pendleton laundry worker.

District Attorney John Walker immediately announced that Doe would be arraigned in Justice court today on a charge of manslaughter.

Joe is accused of killing 27-year-old William Manzaneros, Tacoma, Wash., in a brawl over a girl Sept. 13.

Army Chaplains Corps Now 181 Years Old

Washington — (U.P.) — The Army's Chaplains corps was 181 years old on July 29.

The corps was founded when the Continental Congress conferred official status on chaplains attached to the army. The resolution fixed the pay at \$20 per month, the same salary army captains then received. In the 181 years, 279 chaplains have died in the line of duty in war-time.

3,000 Acres of Upper Klamath Wildlife Refuge To Be Open to Waterfowl Hunting This Season

Tulake, Calif. — Opening of more than 3,000 acres of Upper Klamath national wildlife refuge to public hunting through the coming waterfowl season has been announced by refuge manager Thomas C. Horn. The open area is in the vicinity of Rocky Point in the northwestern part of Upper Klamath lake and includes refuge lands in sections 35 and 38, T 35 S, R 6 E, and sections 1, 2, 3, 11, 12, 13 and 14, T 36 S, R 6 E.

No refuge permits will be required but hunters must have state hunting licenses and duck stamps as required by law. Hunters can enter the public hunting area up to two hours before the daily shooting time during the season.

No Prior Right
While boat travel in the main channel from Rocky Point to the lake is open at all times the marsh area and Crystal creek will be closed to all boat travel until two hours before shooting time on Oct. 13, the opening day. Airthrust boats and scull boats will not be permitted on the public hunting area this year.

Construction of blinds in the public hunting area does not give the builder a prior right to the area of that particular blind. All portions of the public hunting area are open on a first come first served basis.

Each hunter can use up to two retrieving dogs in the public hunting area.

The fall migration of waterfowl is now well under way. More than 2,000,000 ducks and geese are now present in the Klamath basin.

Miami Beach — (U.P.) — Young Jimmy Beecham, Miami welterweight, is favored at 7-5 to repeat his December victory over West Indian Hector Constance tonight in their return 10-rounder at the Miami Beach Municipal auditorium.
