

45 Schools Being Served By Speech, Hearing Clinic

Ashland—A record 45 schools in Jackson, Josephine, and Curry counties are now being served by the cooperative speech and hearing center at Southern Oregon college, Leon C. Mulling, director of the speech clinic, and associate professor of speech, has announced.

Mulling explained that in each school diagnostic clinics are held to determine what type of speech disorders children have, and what causes them. A home and school program is then outlined for the children with parents, teachers, public health nurses, special educators, and speech therapists participating as need is indicated.

Nixon to Suggest Ike Visit States With Senate Fights

Washington — (U.P.) — Vice President Richard M. Nixon today rushed into extensive conferences with GOP leaders less than 12 hours after returning from his 32-state campaign swing.

One of his top recommendations was expected to be that President Eisenhower visit more key states where GOP senatorial candidates are fighting uphill battles.

The vice president also planned to spend part of the day working on his notes for an unusual half-hour televised press conference tonight with newsmen in eight cities across the nation.

Tears Into Stevenson

He returned to the capital shortly before midnight after ending his 16-day 15,000-mile trip at Philadelphia by tearing into Adlai Stevenson's foreign policy statements.

Nixon called the Democratic presidential nominee's proposal that the United States end nuclear weapon tests "catastrophic nonsense." And referring to his tour he told a wildly-cheering crowd of more than 3,000 people at Philadelphia's historic academy of music.

"I can report to you with confidence that President Eisenhower will be reelected as president of the United States."

Reports on Campaign

Nixon will use part of his half-hour news conference tonight to report on his first campaign trip. Eight newsmen — one from each of the areas Nixon visited during the trip — will cut in from his home city with questions.

More than 150 NBC stations across the nation will carry the program from 8:30 to 9 p.m. (EDT). The GOP National Committee purchased the time.

Communists Build Post Near Quemoy

Quemoy — (U.P.) — The Chinese Communists are building a causeway to a small island near Quemoy which would enable them to bombard this Nationalist offshore island outpost incessantly, a military spokesman disclosed today.

The spokesman said the Communists began work last year on a 2,000-yard causeway between the mainland and tiny Tating Tao Island only 6,000 yards from Quemoy but that Nationalist artillery has left gaps in the vital link.

He said if the Reds complete the causeway they can bring in an endless supply of ammunition for guns already in place there. But as long as they must depend on waterborne transportation Quemoy will be spared heavy artillery barrages.

In the past, he said, the Communists have been able to bring in about 200 rounds a week by junk which would be increased to 1,000 rounds a day over the new link.

Tating Tao is a flat island lying directly between Quemoy and the mainland. The Reds have been able to transport enough heavy guns by ship to reach most of the Nationalist island stronghold, but have been unable to knock Quemoy out.

Agreement Imminent In Union Dispute

Antioch, Calif. — (U.P.) — Harry Lundberg, secretary-treasurer of the Sailors Union of the Pacific, said Wednesday an agreement "seems imminent" in the union's attempt to put an American crew aboard a picketed Liberian registry freighter.

Lundberg and representatives of the ship's owners met again today in an attempt to end the dispute which has kept the freighter Duncan Bay tied up at the new Crown Zellerbach paper mill since she arrived with a load of pulp from the Northwest last Tuesday. The sailors began picketing the ship as soon as she arrived here.

The union contends the ship, which is American owned, should carry an American crew.

"Successful therapy naturally depends on the extent to which parents and teachers cooperate with the therapist," Mulling said. "In the majority of schools, cooperation has been excellent, and the children have shown decided improvement."

Nov. 1, Gold Beach, Ophir; Nov. 2, Port Orford, Langlois; Nov. 5, Riverside, Murphy; Nov. 6, Oak Grove, Merlin, Hugo, Sunny Valley, Wolf Creek; Nov. 13, Rogue River, Evans Valley; Nov. 19, Illinois Valley; Nov. 20, Junior high and extras; Nov. 26, Sams Valley, Griffin Creek; Nov. 27, Central Point and Gold Hill.

There is a clinic scheduled for Dec. 3 at Lone Pine on a tentative basis, Mulling said.

Trustbuster Denies Stock in Company

Washington — (U.P.) — Edward A. Foote, who recently resigned as the government's No. 2 trustbuster, Wednesday night denied dealing in the stock of a company whose merger was under government scrutiny. He said his wife did, however.

Chairman Emanuel Celler (D-N.Y.) accused Foote of such transactions Wednesday in a press release distributed in the House press gallery.

Celler said that "virtually every week during the two-year period Mr. Foote was employed by the anti-trust division of the Justice Department, he (Foote) placed orders for substantial stock purchases or sales in numerous companies."

Several of these companies, Celler said, were involved at the time in pending investigations being made by the anti-trust division.

Celler said Foote resigned Sept. 13, eight days after his subcommittee's investigators notified the Justice Department of the stock market activities.

Employees Willed Big Department Store

Fort Myers, Fla. — (U.P.) — Nine employees of the huge M. Flossie Hill's department store found themselves the owners of the 51-year old establishment today.

Miss M. Flossie Hill, who died last week, directed in her will that the store be sold and the proceeds be divided among nine employees according to their length of service.

All of the nine employees had worked for Miss Hill 10 years or more.

Miss Hill said in her will that if the employees desired they could operate the store together or one of them could buy the others out.

Poznan Spectators Believed Hand Picked

Washington — (U.P.) — Western diplomatic sources estimated today that 80 per cent of the spectators attending the Poznan riot trials are hand picked by the Polish Communist secret police.

These sources said information that the Poznan court room is heavily packed with government agents came from "very reliable sources." They refused to elaborate, or to permit identification of the source of the information in Washington.

But the report tended to undercut the surface air of fairness that has marked the Poznan proceedings.
