The Medical Roundup

A BETTER CHOICE OF PARENTS

Many thoughtful persons ask if there shouldn't be a law against the bearing of children by persons who carry some hereditary disease, which is likely to appear in one or two out of every four of the children they may bring into the world. Often these children have to suffer terribly all their days. Many of them have to be brought up and supported by the community, and the bill for their care in just one state runs into millions of dollars.

An answer to these questions was given recently by Dr. B. Glas, in the Johns Hopkins Hospital magazine. As he said, there is no question that states would be justified in saying that certain persons, such as feeble-minded girls, should not be allowed to run around bearing one illegitimate child after another, usually sired by some good-for-nothing man. Such feeble-minded girls can easily be sterilized without any harm to them.

Anyone who would like to know what large sums the care of the descendants of just one such woman can cost should read two books, one by Dugdale and one by Esterbrook, telling about the Jukes, a family of degenerates living in New York state. A large percentage of the members of this family have been petty thieves, vagrants, alcoholic bums, and prostitutes.

Others Could Transmit Defect
The great objection to any eugenic plan is that the brothers and sisters of a feeble-minded girl can carry just as well as the girl can, and they are not likely to consent to sterilization unless they are trained in science or in the breeding of fine animals.

It would, of course, be wonderful if all persons who are carriers of some serious mental or nervous or muscular disease could know the tremendous danger that will come to some of the children they may have. Doubtless then, many of these persons would choose not to have any children. I see many women who say, "I would never have a child because I would not run the risk of condemning someone to suffer as terribly as I and some of my brothers and sisters have suffered."

To show how dangerous it is for two persons with a similar poor inheritance to marry, a friend of mine, whose uncle was epileptic, married a lovely woman whose aunt was in a mental hospital. Their first child was an epileptic idiot. Both of these parents, and all four of the of the grandparents were fine, able and sensible persons, but apparently my friend and perhaps his wife were carriers of nervous diseases.

One of the next great problems in medicine that we humans must tackle is the problem of apparently normal carriers of disease. Let two of them marry and almost all of their children can suffer terribly. A point that I have to make to all people with serious nervous disease who ask me about marrying, is that no genetics counselor will tell them not to have children. All a counselor does is to tell the people what the chances are that they will have defective children. Then, if they want to go ahead and take the risk, that is their decision. I wish to emphasize this point so that a number of people will not write me angrily to say that I had no right to forbid them to marry. I never in my life forbade anyone to marry.

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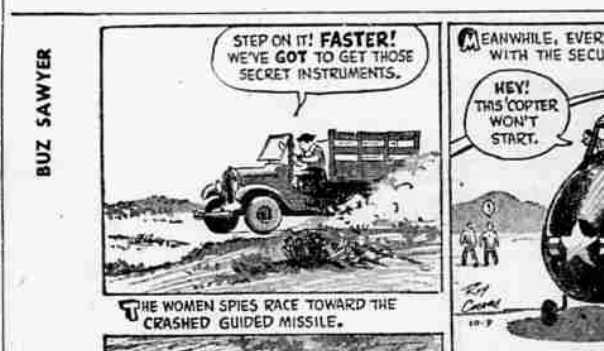
