

Dispute Over Negro Vote Right, Other Race Items Flare in South

Disputes over rights of Negroes to vote, to sit with whites in football stands and on buses, and to equal opportunities in the armed forces erupted in the South today.

The U.S. Department of Justice asked Congress Wednesday to investigate whether Negroes are being illegally deprived of voting rights in Pierce county, Ga., and in Ouachita and Rapides Parishes, La.

City officials of Tallahassee, Fla., asked a state legislative committee to investigate a racial bus boycott and activities of

the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Sen. Herbert H. Lehman (D-N.Y.) asked Defense Secretary Charles Wilson to investigate a charge that Negro servicemen at Donaldson Air Force Base and Fort Jackson, S.C., are being denied educational courses.

Charges Deliberate Slap
A segregationist leader accused the Navy of deliberately "slapping us in the face" in selling tickets to the Tulane football game without regard to race.

Louisiana's new law banning racial mixing of spectators at athletic events does not go into

effect until two days after the Tulane-Navy game Saturday. A Navy spokesman said, "We have always sold available tickets to anyone who applied."

J. B. Easterly, head of the Southern Gentlemen, said "The people of Louisiana believe that Navy—and that's the federal government"—ignore the state's racial customs "with malicious intent."

Urges Vote Investigation
Assistant Attorney General Warren Olney III, head of the federal Justice Department's Criminal Division, urged the Senate subcommittee on cam-

paign practices in Washington Wednesday to investigate the vote-violation complaints.

Olney said he believed that if the subcommittee will conduct hearings on the cases in Georgia and Louisiana before the Nov. 6 election it "would result in hundreds of voters being restored to the rolls."

Sen. Albert Gore (D-Tenn.), subcommittee chairman, said Olney's request will be considered at a later closed session. Olney said his department is already investigating.

Chinese Mobs Turn Vengeance on Europeans in Second Day of Riots

Hong Kong—(U.P.)—Chinese mobs turned their vengeance on foreigners today in the second day of rioting in this British colony. One mob tried to burn a man and his wife to death by drenching their car with gasoline and setting it afire.

The government sent British troops to the riot scene in Kowloon, the part of the colony lying on the mainland next to Communist China—a step Hong Kong has never taken before lest it offend the Chinese Communist government.

The rioting started between pro-Communist and pro-Nationalist Chinese refugees Wednesday in Kowloon during the Nationalist celebration of the "Double Tenth," the 45th anni-

versary of the founding of the Chinese Republic by Sun Yat-Sen.

Breaks Out Anew
It raged through the day and night and broke out afresh today, with Europeans the chief target of the inflamed Chinese.

But the mobs also battled among themselves, stoned police, fired and looted buildings, their passions inflamed by agitators bent on spreading trouble in this precariously-situated British outpost.

Official sources said four persons were killed, two Wednesday and two today. Scores were reported injured, some 40 to 50 seriously. More than 100 persons were under arrest.

One huge group of Chinese formed a roadblock near the North Star Ferry and stopped all cars not bearing Chinese Nationalist flags. The Nationalist flag appeared to be a passport, but there were occasional yells

for Mao Tse-Tung, the Chinese Communist leader.

Woman Stripped, Beaten
One European woman was stripped to her underclothes this morning and beaten by a mob. She was reported seriously injured.

The U. S. Consulate ordered all of its employees to go directly to their homes from work today and stay off the streets until the violence ends.

The U. S. Air Force cancelled the flights of all incoming military planes until further notice and restricted all its personnel to their hotels.

Chinese Students Serenade Nixon At San Francisco

En Route With Nixon—(U.P.)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon turned his second coast to coast campaign flight eastward today, but he couldn't be blamed if he thought his stops in Nevada and Colorado a little drab after San Francisco.

Nixon was probably the first national candidate to be serenaded by a Chinese high school drum and glockenspiel corps playing "When Irish Eyes Are Smiling."

Or to be nuzzled by a 250-foot cloth dragon ablaze with electric lights.

All this took place on the eve of Nixon's departure. He left this morning for Elko, Nev., and Boulder and Denver, Colo.

Rugged Bafnstrom Tour
Nixon met the dragon just before he made his seventh speech in a rugged 18-hour of barnstorming through northern California. He rode in a parade through Chinatown's "Double Ten" (Fourth of July) celebration watched by an estimated 30,000 persons, and then spoke from the reviewing stand.

The vice president pledged that his party would never "give away hope" that China and other captive peoples of the Communist bloc would someday be free.

Nixon said Stevenson's suggestions for ending the draft and hydrogen bomb tests "would tremendously increase the chances for war or surrender or both."

Judge Lonergan Eyed Disqualification of

Portland—(U.P.)—District Attorney William M. Langley today sought to have Circuit Judge Frank J. Lonergan disqualified from hearing any part of two cases against Langley which arose after the recent Multnomah county grand jury investigation.

Langley filed two motions yesterday afternoon in the clerk's office of the Circuit Court. In both he asked that Judge Lonergan be disqualified and that the cases be transferred to another court.

Kefauver Charges Hero Worship of Big Businessmen

En Route With Kefauver—(U.P.)—Sen. Estes Kefauver told an Iowa farm audience today the Eisenhower administration has fostered a hero worship of big businessmen.

"They are the golfing companions of the President and the men who come to dinner at the White House," the Democratic vice presidential candidate said. He made the statement in a speech prepared for delivery at a luncheon meeting in Indianola, Iowa.

Kefauver said the people of Iowa have been caught, during the Eisenhower administration "in a serious cost-price squeeze."

He predicted that under administration policies "things are going to get worse."

Wait and See
"If you think prices are high now just wait a few months," the slow spoken Tennesseean said.

He quoted published predictions that 1957 auto prices will be up \$125 to \$250 and household appliances 10 per cent higher. He said farmers, under the forecasts, will have to pay \$100 to \$200 more for tractors with gasoline prices in some areas "edging close to the incredible level of 40 cents a gallon."

He said Mr. Eisenhower, "if he really wants to protect the American consumer," could personally ask business leaders to curb their drive for profits. He said the President could direct appropriate agencies to find out and report on what corporations are profiteering "and by how much."

Britain Carries Out Nuclear Air Drop

Melbourne, Australia—(U.P.)—Britain carried out its first nuclear weapon air-drop at the Maralinga Proving Grounds in southern Australia today, it was announced.

Australian Minister of Supply Hoard Beale said the bomb was released from a Valiant jet bomber.

It was the third nuclear device to be detonated during the current series of tests at the proving grounds by the British ministry of supply.

Scientists said they expected the latest test to result in less fallout than the previous blasts because minute radioactive particles would remain high in the atmosphere.

Klamath Indians Subject To State Tax

Klamath Falls—(U.P.)—Officials of the Klamath Indians said today that a ruling handed down by the attorney general's office means that members of the Indian tribe are subject to an Oregon state inheritance tax.

William Dougherty, special assistant attorney general in charge of taxes, made the ruling at the request of local attorneys. He said the tax applies to land handed down to heirs by tribal members but is not applicable in relation to the Klamath Termination act.
