### Casper, McMullen On Top in Western

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The finest field in the 53 years of the Western Open golf championship went to the post in the second round today with a trio of young unknowns leading the star-studded pack of tournament champions.

The men to catch are 25-year-old Billy Casper, a two-year professional from Chula Vista, Calif.; 21-year-old John McMullen, an amateur star from Alameda, Calif., each teeing off with four-under-par 68s, and 27-year-old Don January of Lampasas, Tex., who went to the first tee with a 69.

**No Runaway**  
While the youngsters led, they weren't making a runaway of it from the tried-and-true professional money winners. Defending champion Dr. Cary Middlecott, who also is the current National Open champion, is right close with a 70, along with a half-dozen other expert shot-makers.

In fact, 30 men from the field of 162 that teed off shot even-par of 72 or better. And of these, 18 broke the magic number.

The first round of the exacting Presidio Golf club course was played in perfect weather—sun-

ny and very little wind. But the experts can expect more hazards from the elements in the future.

Prospect—Coach Wes Stauffer announced today that Prospect High school has forfeited its football game scheduled Saturday night with St. Mary's at Medford and that the Cougars are dropping out of interscholastic football for the rest of the season.

The mentor said that injuries and sickness on the squad plus a transfer had made it impossible to field a club and continue its schedule of games with other schools. He reported that a six-man intramural program is planned at this school.

### Bob Sheffing To Skipper Chicago Cubs

Chicago — (U.P.) — Bob Sheffing, a former Chicago Cubs coach and catcher, was named today to succeed Stan Hack as manager of the team.

He was given a one-year contract.

Sheffing, 43, this season managed the Cubs' farm team in Los Angeles to the Pacific Coast league pennant.

He was named to the Cubs' job by John Holland, former Los Angeles president and general manager who Thursday was appointed by owner Phil Wrigley as the man in control of the Cubs.

### John Sullivan, Calhoun Tussle

Cleveland — (U.P.) — Rory Calhoun, of White Plains, N.Y., and England's Johnny Sullivan, a pair of mauling middleweights, meet in a 10-round nationally televised match tonight at the Cleveland arena.

Calhoun, currently sixth-ranked contender, was an 8-5 choice to beat Sullivan and start another winning string. The 22-year-old son of an Atlanta minister suffered his first professional defeat Aug. 29 at the hands of Spider Webb. The loss, a split decision, ended a string of 23 victories since Calhoun turned professional two years ago. Twelve of his victories were knockouts.

Sullivan, 23, has 60 victories, 20 losses and three ties. He has knocked out 35. But the former British Empire middleweight champion lost more than he has won in the United States.
