Arthritis in Farmers

The Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation, in a recent release, commented on the fact, as yet not understood, that farmers suffer most often from arthritis. It would seem that arthritis must be connected in some way with the farmer's long days of hard work, out of doors in all sorts of weather. The foundation suggests that the farmer get more rest, and that he try not to overdo when plowing and reaping.

In Today's Health, John D. Gallagher tells of a woman who, while cleaning her baseboard with a damp cloth picked up a metal floor lamp to move it out of the way. At the same time her leg came against the radiator. The lamp had a wiring defect, her hands were wet, and the radiator was well-grounded through its pipe connections. As a result, the lady lost her life by electrocution.

Hundreds of women have been electrocuted while in their tub. With a foot in the water, and with a wet hand which makes a good electrical connection, they reached to turn off a light, an electric fan, or an electric heater—and that was the end of them. According to the underwriters, electric apparatus should be so made that this sort of thing cannot happen, but often lamps or electric appliances in a home are old or poorly made.

Nearly Electrocuted I once came within an ace of being electrocuted when I picked up one piece of electric apparatus with one hand while I had another apparatus in the other hand. In a moment with the powerful currents surging through me, my muscles were rigid and it was impossible for me to let go of either of the instruments. Then two nurses with me froze stiff with horror and could not move. The only way I got free was to back off and pull one of the wires off the wall. Perhaps in the future someone may save his life by remembering this little trick of pulling an appliance out of its socket.

A high percentage of all accidents take place in the home, and many of these would never have happened if the people had taken pains to avoid it. For instance, many a woman loses her life falling off a rickety ladder, or a ladder which has no rubber on the bottom to keep it from slipping on the floor. Usually, when one climbs a ladder one should have someone holding it so that it will not slip or topple over.

Many a time in my home, going upstairs to bed, I have found a roller skate on the stair, a skate which one of my grandchildren

had left there. What a magnificent trap this was for anyone who would come down during the night! Because of something movable left on a stair many an elderly person has died of a broken neck, or a broken hip with the subsequent pneumonia. A torn piece of carpet on the stair has also caused many a person to lose his life or to become a cripple.

Small Light in Bathroom Often persons would do well at night to leave a small light on in the bathroom or over the stairway. One of my good friends, a woman of 50, recently died of a broken neck. What happened was that getting up and going to the bathroom in the dark and half asleep, she turned

the wrong way in the hall and fell headlong down a flight of stairs. Another common man-trap in the home is a long telephone or lamp cord. A hundred times I have tripped dangerously over such a cord. In many cases it should have been run under the carpet.

Another vicious killer of men and women is the small rug lying on a waxed floor. One step and out go one's feet from under one. Far better than a Blue Cross membership or a life insurance

policy is a rubber cushion under each small rug. In winter, in the northern tier of states, when everything is covered with a thin sheet of very slippery ice, it is good insurance to scatter some sand or cinders over the icy spots.

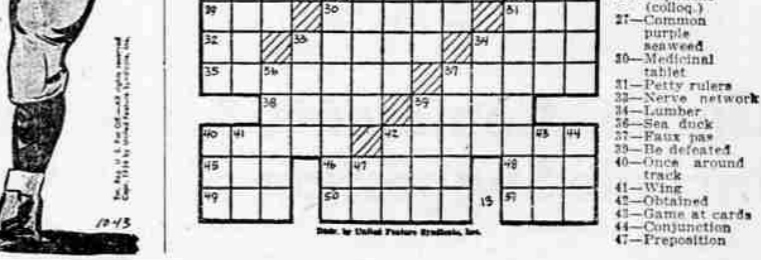
