

# New York Times Backs Eisenhower; Criticizes Nixon

New York — U.P. — The New York Times today endorsed President Eisenhower for reelection but criticized the GOP choice of Vice President Richard M. Nixon as his running mate.

The independent newspaper supported Mr. Eisenhower in 1952. Its 1956 endorsements appeared in an editorial in today's editions.

### Commends Both Candidates

It commended both the President and Adlai Stevenson for sharing a middle-of-the-road position and having in common "a distrust of extremist positions and a clearly demonstrated faith in both the philosophy and method of moderation."

The editorial said there were two "persuasive" arguments in favor of the reelection of the President:

"First, despite disappointments, there is much in the record of the Eisenhower administration that is of real and lasting value to the country.

"Second, it is a matter of major importance that the modernization of the Republican Party and its rescue from the rut of reaction into which it had fallen after 20 years out of power be carried forward another stage under the leadership of Mr. Eisenhower.

### Nixon Worked Hard

The newspaper said the selection of Nixon was one of the things which have not gone the way it wished they might have gone, but it said Nixon had worked hard and has grown with his job.

The editorial said it continued to hold the opinion that Stevenson was the strongest candidate the Democratic Party could nominate for the presidency. But it said it sharply disagreed with Stevenson's statement that selective service might be ended "in the not far distant future."

### Light Plane Pilot Ends 21st Atlantic Crossing

Shannon Airport, Ireland — U.P. — San Francisco businessman Max Conrad ended his 21st crossing of the Atlantic Ocean by light plane today.

With him as passenger was Howard Simmons, a writer for the World Science Syndicate Magazine, Washington, D.C., who is en route to Russia to meet other science writers.

# Kefauver Prepares Telecast; Tours New York City Area

New York — U.P. — Sen. Estes Kefauver temporarily took time out from lambasting Vice President Richard M. Nixon today to prepare for his first nationwide telecast.

The Democratic vice presidential candidate spent an 18-hour day campaigning Monday in Vermont and the New York City area with Nixon as his principal target.

The Tennessee Democrat, after a press conference, planned to spend the afternoon working on and rehearsing his 9 p.m. (EDT) telecast.

### Addresses Street Rallies

Kefauver, carrying his campaign to the streets of New York, Monday went on a whirlwind 100-mile motorcade, addressing street rallies in Queens with Tammany Hall boss Carmine de Sapio and retiring Sen. Herbert H. Lehman (D-N.Y.).

But he drew his biggest and most enthusiastic crowds Monday night after his motorcade reached normally Republican parts of Long Island.

He drew applause from an overflow crowd of several hundred at Windmere, N.Y., when he labelled Nixon "the darling of the reactionary Republicans."

### Nixon Smear Charged

Former Rep. Helen Gahagan Douglas of California sat on the platform as Kefauver accused Nixon of using "smear" tactics to defeat Mrs. Douglas in the 1950 race for the Senate. Kefauver praised her as "one of the finest members of the House" who was beaten by an undercover campaign which accused her of Communist ties.

### Army Officers Die In Crash of Plane

Honolulu — U.P. — Two 25th Division Army officers were killed instantly Monday when their light observation plane crashed in a sugar can field in northern Oahu island.

The Army identified one of the victims as Capt. Henry K. Bradshaw, 32, whose wife and daughter live in Schofield Barracks. He was the passenger in the plane, an L19.

The pilot's name was withheld until his next of kin could be notified.

# Dulles Reiterates Stand on Aggression

Washington — U.P. — Secretary of State John Foster Dulles said today the United States stands behind its pledges to help any nation which might be the victim of aggression in the Middle East.

Dulles took a grave view, at his news conference, on rising tension in the Middle East.

He said Israel's reprisal raids against Jordan, for example, indicate a deterioration of that situation and failure of UN efforts earlier this year to ease the tensions.

Dulles was asked about President Eisenhower's April 9 declaration that the United States would help a victim of aggression if big trouble broke in that area. The reporter asked if the United States still stands ready to help.

"Yes, that still holds," Dulles said.

He said the United States would assist if there were aggression, but he did not say how this would be done.
