After the business meeting a movie, entitled "We Serve", was shown and explained the different Junior Red Cross activities.

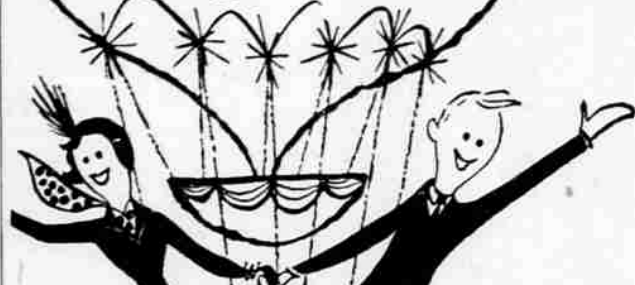
