

Stevenson Challenges Ike's Contention on H-Bomb Testing

New York —(U.P.)— Adlai E. Stevenson challenged Tuesday night President Eisenhower's contention that an end to hydrogen bomb testing would weaken the relative military position of the United States.

The Democratic presidential nominee told a Democratic rally in Madison Square Garden that on the contrary an end to H-bomb tests would increase this nation's "peace power."

He said the peace and health of the world would be advanced and that he did not think "this nation wants the great decisions about the H-bomb entrusted to Richard M. Nixon."

He denied that such an agreement would deprive the United States of any of its retaliatory striking power.

"We would continue to work on defense against attack," he said. "We would strive for the balanced forces needed for the most probable type of conflict. We would be stronger, not weaker."

Ike Issues Report
Stevenson wrote his nationally televised and broadcast speech before the President issued a special government report Tuesday on nuclear weapons and disarmament.

Mr. Eisenhower declared that he refused to stop H-bomb tests unless Russia and other atomic powers agree to a foolproof system of international inspection and safeguards. He also said that present testing does not imperil the health of humanity.

Stevenson did not comment on the President's remarks in his address before 18,000 persons at the rally Tuesday night.

In a prepared speech Stevenson told businessmen today that the Democratic party is their "best friend."

Stevenson said he challenged the idea that the GOP is the "party of business" and Democrats are "anti-business."

He said under the New Deal action was taken to make "America safe for capitalism" and "capitalism safe for America."

Speaks at Luncheon
"I believe that the Democratic Party is the best friend American business has..." Stevenson said.

His remarks were scheduled for delivery at a businessmen's lunch, the first in a series of six talks he planned for New York and its suburbs today and tonight.

Stevenson said two questions lie at the heart of the issue to end hydrogen bomb tests.

"One, will the peace and health of the world be advanced if all nations stop exploding hydrogen weapons? The answer is yes.

"Two, would such an agreement weaken the relative military position of the U.S.? The answer is no."

He referred to the awesome capacity for destruction of U.S. nuclear stockpiles and said, "by entering such an agreement, we lose none of our war power. We gain peace power."

Ike To Woo 'Petticoat' Vote in Appearance Before Ladies' Panel

Washington —(U.P.)— President Eisenhower today went a-wooing the petticoat vote that in 1952 was credited widely with supplying much of his victory margin.

The Chief Executive planned to make a special nationwide television appearance for women this afternoon.

Before the telecast the White House was expected to announce new campaign speaking dates for the President. Under consideration was speeches in Texas, Florida, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania. The President speaks Thursday night at Madison Square Garden in New York.

The Republican National Committee which selected the panel said the ladies would ask "leading questions of special interest to women." The GOP called the telecast tailored for women a "first" in political history.

The Chief Executive Tuesday

night concentrated on labor, telling the 75th anniversary dinner of the AFL-CIO Carpenters Union that labor's share of the national income was at a 20-year high.

He accented this point to refute the Democratic charge that the Republican administration is "dedicated to furthering the interest of big business."

"Of course, that is not true," the President told the union banquet audience of about 1,300 people. "If it were true, I am sure big business would assert we have failed miserably in our alleged mission."

He said that from 1946 through 1952 under a Democratic administration corporate profits after taxes averaged 7.7 per cent of the national income. He said since 1953, when he entered office, corporate pro-

fits after taxes averaged 6 per cent of the national income.

Says Income Rises
While this has been going on labor's share in the national income has been rising progressively," he said. "It is now 76 per cent—the highest in the last 20 years."

One obvious reason for Mr. Eisenhower's four-hour appearance at the carpenters' union celebration was the fact that Maurice A. Hutcheson, president of the brotherhood, voted in the AFL-CIO Executive Council against endorsing Democratic presidential nominee Adlai Stevenson. Stevenson won the endorsement.

Mr. Eisenhower also indicated to the carpenters union that the United States was ready to offer aid to resistive Soviet satellites that want it.

Boxcar Shortage In Inland Empire

Spokane —(U.P.)— Federal assistance was asked today to help relieve a shortage of railroad boxcars needed to ship grain out of the Inland Empire.

Rep. Walt Horan (R-Wash.) said he asked the Interstate Commerce commission for prompt action in speeding the return of boxcars to the area from throughout the nation.

Horan said the six railroads serving the area have been unable to meet the unexpected demand for cars and cannot fill all their shipping orders.
