### Algeria Rebels Tell Freedom Talk Plans

Algiers—(U.P.)—To leaders of the Algeria rebellion whose capture touched off a major crisis in North Africa have disclosed plans for freedom talks with officials of Morocco and Tunisia, it was reported today. French authorities captured five leaders of the anti-French nationalist movement here Monday night, touching off protests from Moslem nations and a series of riots and strikes across North Africa.

The extremists were captured when a plane taking them from Rabat, Morocco, to a meeting in Tunisia was forced down at Algiers' Maison Blanche Airfield.

### Nash Ambassador Hikes Horsepower

Detroit—(U.P.)—The 1957 Nash Ambassador goes on sale at dealerships across the country featuring increased horsepower and a four-lamp headlight system designed to give up to 100 extra feet of illumination. New engines generating 255 horsepower, up 35 from 1956 models, power all four models in the new line—the custom country club hardtop, super country club hardtop, custom four-door sedan.

Power brakes are standard equipment on custom models and optional on supers. Power steering and power window lifts are optional on both series. The new headlamps are mounted in vertical pairs in the front fenders. Each lamp measures 5 3/4 inches in diameter, compared with seven inches for conventional lights. All four lamps are used for the high beam. Only the upper two are used for the low beam.
