

### Penny-Wise Traveler Finds Tax Map Useful

Chicago—U.P.—If he's on his toes, the penny-wise traveler will go to Missouri to have his gas tank filled and will avoid Louisiana when buying cigars and Connecticut when looking for souvenirs.

The reasons are simple economics. In Missouri the gasoline tax is only three cents per gallon, the lowest in the nation. And in Louisiana smokers are paying the highest cigarette tax—eight cents per pack—while in Connecticut the sales tax rate of 3 1/2 per cent is the country's highest.

A tax map prepared by Commerce Clearing House, national reporting authority on tax and business law, shows that gasoline sales or cigarette taxes have gone up in seven states since 1935, and decreased in only one.

South Dakota is the one bright spot in the picture. Sales taxes dropped one per cent there this year.

But in Pennsylvania the sales tax went up to six cents, sales tax jumped to three per cent and the cigarette levy rose to five cents.

Between these two extremes came six other states with tax increases: Connecticut, with the 3 1/2 per cent sales tax and four-cent cigarette tax; Texas, where gas and cigars now have a five-cent tax; Missouri, new two-cent cigarette tax; three other states with cigarette increases—New Jersey, five cents; Ohio, three cents; West Virginia, five cents.

### PIZZA

Yield: About 70 small; 30 large

2 pound bulk 1/2 cup shortening

2 cups sifted all-purpose flour 1/2 cup tomato paste

2 1/2 teaspoons salt 1/2 cup ground beef

1/2 cup onion 1/2 cup cheddar cheese (2 ounces)

1/2 teaspoon salt Crushed oregano

Mash sausage in a cold frying pan. Slowly fry sausage, stirring frequently, until cooked sausage thoroughly in small pieces. Drain. Sift together flour, baking powder, and salt into a mixing bowl. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse corn meal. Add milk. Blend with fork until dry ingredients are just dampened. Knead dough gently, about 3/4 minute. Roll out about 1/4 inch thick. Cut with 1 1/2 or 3-inch round cutter. Place rounds on ungreased baking sheet. Slightly pinch up edges of each round. On each round, place in order tomato paste, cheese, sausage, and oregano. Bake in a 450° F. (very hot) oven about 12 minutes. Serves 60.
