## Eisenhower To Reply To Stevenson Attack On Foreign Policy

Washington—(U.P.)—President Eisenhower's political goals for today were the wooing of New York's crucial vote and answering Adlai E. Stevenson's attacks on his foreign policy.

The President was scheduled to leave Washington by train this morning for a day of campaigning in New York City. He will make a nationwide radio and television address tonight from Madison Square Garden.

**Biting Language Expected**

Mr. Eisenhower was expected in his address to use some of the most biting language of his campaign in answering Stevenson's foreign policy attacks. The President's close associates pictured him as indignant over Stevenson's recent criticism of administration policies in the Suez Canal crisis.

Twice within a week, Stevenson has accused Mr. Eisenhower and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles of not telling the truth about the Suez situation.

Mr. Eisenhower maintains that recent Suez developments have amounted to "good news" while Stevenson insists that the situation has deteriorated rather than improved.

While in New York, Mr. Eisenhower will not undertake an extensive tour of Manhattan and the adjacent boroughs. But upon arrival, he was scheduled to drive from Pennsylvania Railroad station to his temporary headquarters at the Commodore Hotel at the peak of the lunch hour while crowds are heavy on the streets of Manhattan.

The Chief Executive and his political advisers announced Wednesday a tough campaign schedule for him next week. He will speak in Miami and Jacksonville, Fla., Richmond, Va., Dallas, Tex., Oklahoma City, Okla., Philadelphia and possibly some additional cities.

## Two Drivers Cited After Accidents In Area Yesterday

Two drivers were cited Wednesday, but no injuries were reported in two separate accidents on Highway 62 and Highway 99, according to state police.

William F. Jackson, 23, Eagle Point, was cited for having no chauffeur's license, and Eli Thomas Burdett, 74, Eagle Point, was cited for improper passing after an accident north of the Antelope creek bridge on Highway 62.

According to state police, Burdett, who was operating a sedan, was following Jackson, who was operating a dump truck. Both were traveling north. After crossing the bridge, Burdett passed Jackson's truck, then cut in front of the truck. Officers said Jackson swerved to avoid hitting the car and lost control of the truck, which turned over on its side.

**No Injuries**

There were no injuries and Jackson's truck was placed back on its wheels by wrecker. The two vehicles did not collide. The accident occurred at 3:35 p.m.

No citations were issued and no injuries were reported in a two-car collision at 8:41 a.m. Wednesday on Highway 99 at Phoenix.

According to state police, Lee Everett Beene, 66, of 4445 South Pacific highway, Medford, applied the brakes of his car to avoid hitting an unidentified vehicle which had pulled onto the highway in front of him. Another car, operated by Arnold D. Bradley, 26, Burnsville, N.C., attempted to stop and skidded into Beene's vehicle. There were no injuries in the accident and damage to the cars was minor.

## Sulphuric Acid Fumes Kill One; Injure 15

Chicago—(U.P.)—One man was killed and 15 others overcome by sulphuric acid fumes that seeped through a three-story plant that manufactures sausage casings early today.

Three of the 15 persons hospitalized were reported by hospital authorities to be in critical condition.

Ambulances and police wagons rushed the injured to South Town and Holy Cross Hospitals from the Visking Corp., after the fumes apparently seeped through the plant from a vat in the basement.

Police identified the dead man as Thomas Walker of suburban Oak Lawn.

The plants is located on Chicago's Southwest Side in the cleaning industrial district.

## 17,000 Animals in Chicago Cattle Show

Chicago—(U.P.)—Some 17,000 head of steer and heifer calves and yearlings were entered in the 12th annual Chicago Feeder Cattle Show and Sale which opened today.

The cattle will be sold at auction Friday and Saturday. Bidders from 12 or more states were expected to replenish feeder stock on farms and ranches.

Cattle were entered from Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, Missouri, Colorado, Wyoming, South Dakota, Oklahoma, North Dakota, Texas, Illinois and Wisconsin.

## Portland Man Found Guilty by Jury

Bergen Hardy Scott, Portland, was found guilty in circuit court Wednesday after a two-day jury trial before Judge H. K. Hanna on charges of entering a motor vehicle with intent to steal.

Scott, who was arrested by Medford city police June 16, had pleaded innocent in a preliminary hearing. He was represented by court appointed counsel, J. V. Goodwin.

Sentencing by Judge Hanna will be at 1:30 p.m. Thursday.

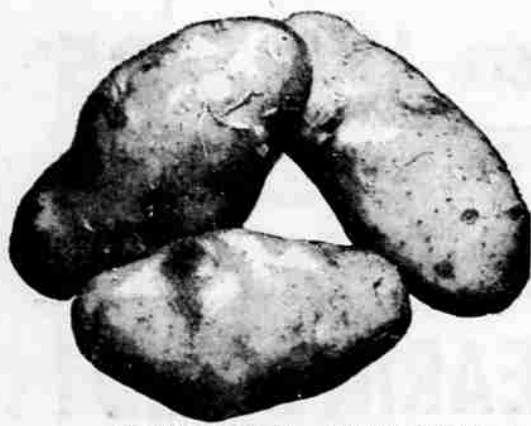
