The Family Council

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Phyllis F.—My parents want me to get a divorce. Mr. D. F.—The man is no good.

Phyllis F.—I am 18 and for the past year I have been secretly married to a man of 33. The reason I didn't tell my parents is that I knew they would not approve because this man is so much older and does not make a good living.

During this year, I have been spending week-ends with my husband and told my parents I was staying with a girl friend. My husband kept urging me to tell my parents, but I couldn't bring myself to do it. At last he couldn't stand it any more and came to my parents' home and announced that we were married. My parents almost went out of their heads and screamed and yelled at him and chased him away.

My parents want me to get a divorce, but I love my husband very much. He is the only one who has been gentle and sympathetic with me. He's had a lot of trouble in his life and only wants to be left in peace with me now.

Mr. D. F.—How can this man possibly be any good? At 33, he marries a girl of 17 and turns her against her family to such an extent that she lies to them for a year and wants to continue lying to them!

Phyllis tries to put this jerk she married in a good light, but I feel quite sure it was his influence that turned her against us and led her to deceive us. He takes the credit for being truthful by crashing our home with this terrible news, but I really think he did it to display his power.

If he were not a sneak and a coward, how could he have failed to come to us, if not before the marriage, then at least directly after? For him to do so only suggests to me that maybe he is too lazy to work and figures we will do something for our daughter.

I have no respect for him and my wife agrees with me.

The Council — These harsh, overbearing parents have driven their daughter into the arms of the first man who needed and offered sympathy and love. The man Mr. D. F. calls a "sneak" and a "jerk" and a "coward" happens to be his daughter's husband. The parents have no right to keep this couple apart or to insult this man. It is, however, entirely up to Phyllis and her husband to recognize this and to take their lives into their own hands. Phyllis wronged herself, her husband and her parents by keeping her marriage a secret. She shows herself to be a very

weak and frightened girl, but she must realize she has taken an important and decisive step. She may not be old enough to "know her mind," as her father points out, but apparently she was old enough to know her own heart. Her need for love drove her to this man and she owes him her loyalty and courage now.

These parents must accept this marriage and stop speaking of their son-in-law with contempt. If he "took advantage" of a girl of 17, it was they who gave him the advantage by so stern a treatment of Phyllis that she did not speak of her marriage for a whole year.
