## Ships Being Sent To Evacuate Americans From Middle East

Washington — (U.P.) — American merchant ships in the Mediterranean are being sent to ports where they can pick up U.S. citizens now being evacuated from the Middle East.

The State Department said Tuesday about 806 Americans already have been moved out or are about to leave Israel and three of its Arab neighbors, Jordan, Egypt and Syria. Another 3,255 or so Americans still are in the four countries.

### 'Every Possible Effort'

The department said "every possible effort" is being made to evacuate persons not vitally needed in the area, particularly dependents, "as rapidly as transportation facilities will permit."

Department Spokesman Lincoln White said several U. S. merchant ships are now in Mediterranean waters and "efforts are being made to divert them to ports" where they can pick up departing Americans.

White said the evacuation program is proceeding according to plan, with the U. S. Embassy in Rome coordinating the process. He gave the following breakdown of the evacuation thus far:

Of an estimated 320 Americans in Jordan, about 250 have

been sent overland to Beirut, Lebanon. About 280 were in Syria. Of these 96 have been evacuated to Beirut, leaving about 184.

### Americans Leave Egypt

In Egypt, more than 400 Americans boarded the American Export Lines ship Exochorda slated to leave Alexandria Tuesday. That left about 1,600 Americans still in Egypt.

"Of some 4,000 Americans in Israel, only about 60 have been moved out thus far. These were sent by air to Athens before the Israeli airfield at Tel Aviv was closed.

Evacuees from Jordan and Syria will be temporarily quartered in Beirut, White said. Those from Israel, he said, will be quartered temporarily in Athens and those from Egypt in Italy, as far as possible.

## The Family Council

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

**T. D.** — Our 15-year-old has gone rock 'n' roll crazy.

**Mrs. T. D.** — Teenagers need understanding.

**T. D.** — Our 15-year-old daughter has become a prize nuisance in the home. She's gone rock 'n' roll crazy and she and her friends fill the house with their horrible sounds every evening. Besides this, she's become a tyrant. She keeps bossing her kid sisters around so much, the poor kids are going crazy. They used to fight a little, like any normal kids, but now the youngsters have become regular little demons, too, in order to spite Dolores.

I've never interfered with the way my wife handled the children, but I think this is going too far. She won't say a word to Dolores no matter what she does. I was brought up on good, old-fashioned discipline and it never hurt me.

**Mrs. T. D.** — My husband doesn't seem to understand anything about the times we're living in. There is so much juvenile delinquency around, I want Dolores and her friends to be in the house. I'd much rather put up with the noise than have them roaming the streets.

Today's teenagers have a lot of pressure on them and I think Dolores is taking out her nerves on her sisters. It's not a good situation, but it's a passing phase and it's important to be very understanding of Dolores at this time of her life.

I think that if my husband were to show a little more kindly interest in Dolores, she might be easier to handle. But he contents himself with pressuring the to discipline her and merely glowering at her.

**The Council:** Mrs. T. D. is right when she feels it is important to be "understanding" of teenagers, but she is wrong when she thinks that understanding means indulgence. She shows very little understanding of Dolores when she permits her to "take out her nerves" on her kid sisters and to make the home a bedlam for adults.

When Dolores bosses her kid sisters, she may be trying to show her parents what she needs and wants of them—a little authority, a sense of limitations. The feelings that there is no required standard of behavior is at least as upsetting to the teenager as the feeling that the parents do not "understand" or will not permit enough freedom.

Teenagers depend on their parents to hold the reins. Letting go robs them of all sense of security. They want to fight for their freedom and should be expected to prove their maturity and respect for the rights of others with each new inch of maturity and respect for the rights of others with each new inch of freedom they are granted.

Mr. T. D. has been awakened to his own responsibilities rather late. A father's concern about his children's behavior is not "interference." He has turned the responsibility entirely over to his wife and becomes concerned only because his peace of mind is being disturbed. He ought to be more concerned about his children's welfare. Dolores is more of a victim of his wife's mistaken notions than he is. These parents need to get together in establishing order in this home.

## East Germany Puts Anti-Reds in Jail To Prevent Revolt

Berlin — (U.P.) — East Germany announced today the arrests of 73 anti-Communists in an apparent effort to prevent any Hungarian-type revolt from exploding against the Soviet dominated Red German regime.

The Communists said the arrested Germans were "Western spies," the usual Red terminology for anti-Communists.

**Round-Up of Leaders**  
The arrests were believed designed to round up the potential leaders of a resistance movement and thus nip in the bud any plans for a revolt.

A West Berlin newspaper said the German Communists are purging the ranks of their Secret Police as a precautionary measure. Der Abend said a "wave of arrests" had been made and that "several leading officials" were among those seized.

The simmering unrest among East German students was pointed up today with disclosure of demands for an end to the compulsory study of Marxism in universities and attacks on Communism. The disclosure was made in a letter to the official Communist party newspaper Neues Deutschland complaining against "forces influenced by events in Hungary and Poland."

**Attempts To Be Crushed**  
East Berlin Communist leader Alfred Neumann warned Tuesday that Communist troops and police will crush any attempt by East Germans to emulate the rebels in Hungary.

Soviet tanks have ringed Ber-

lin to back up the threat, the West Berlin newspaper Tagespiegel reported. It quoted German travelers as its source.

## ELECT a District Attorney Who Will solve the mystery of the Cating Report

On June 12, 1953, the incumbent District Attorney asked the County Court for funds for investigation of alleged "dope" in Jackson County. The County Court granted the request.

According to his own Primary Campaign statements, Nunley hired one Walter Jeffries as a special investigator. He states that Jeffries assumed the name "J. P. Cating" for the investigation.

The records of the County Clerk show the issuance of county warrants to "J. P. Cating" for \$700.00 during June, July and August, 1953; two warrants for \$350 each during September, 1953, a total of \$2,800.

According to Nunley, "Walter Jeffries" orally explained his "report" to a small group of private citizens. Nunley claims the "report" is in his private files.

A local newspaper has charged that the alleged investigation was of the incumbent Sheriff's office. Nunley has neither admitted nor denied this charge.

### We Ask Nunley in the Public Interest to Answer These Questions

1. Why did he use funds reportedly voted for a narcotics investigation, for some other purpose not authorized?
2. Were the funds used to investigate the Sheriff's office or were they not?
3. If so, who authorized their use for that purpose?
4. Why was it necessary to employ an outside investigator at an extra expense of \$2,800 to the taxpayers instead of using the services of the Medford City Police, the Sheriff's office or the State Police?
5. Why was not this report made public to those who paid for it — the taxpayers; or, if confidential, why not submitted to the County Grand Jury?
6. Since it was paid for by the public, why do you keep it in your private files?
7. Why have you not had "J. P. Cating" or "Walter Jeffries" come forward to verify what you claim for them and explain why the report cannot be made public?
