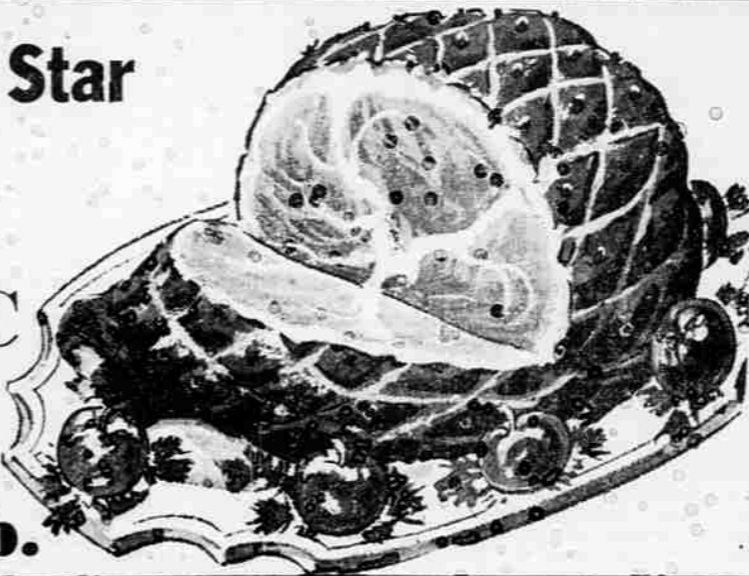

**Eisenhower To Reply To Stevenson Charges On Middle East Crisis**

Washington (AP)—President Eisenhower fires back at Adlai E. Stevenson today for what the GOP regards as Democratic efforts to make political hay out of the Middle East fighting.

Mr. Eisenhower was scheduled to make the nationwide television and radio campaign address from Convention Hall in Philadelphia at 9:30 p.m. (EST). He will travel from Washington to Philadelphia by train in the early evening and fly back to Washington immediately after his address.

**Indignant Over Charges**  
The President was known to be indignant over charges by the Democratic presidential candidate that the current shooting involving Israel, Egypt, Great Britain and France could have been avoided had it not been for "bungling" administration foreign policy.

The White House ignored for the moment the Stevenson telegram to the President Wednesday night counseling Mr. Eisenhower against any "hasty" action in sending American troops abroad. But later developments on Stevenson's telegram were likely.

The Chief Executive in his report to the nation Wednesday night on the Middle East said, "there will be no United States involvement in these present hostilities." That, for the present was regarded by the White House as sufficient answer to Stevenson, who sent his message to the White House shortly before the President spoke.

**One of Last Talks**  
Mr. Eisenhower's address in Philadelphia will be one of his last campaign appearances. The only other campaign date known to be under active consideration was next Monday night in Boston. A definite announcement on Boston may be made today or Friday.

**Mother Confesses Engineering Son's Murder of Father**

Hammond, Ind. (AP)—Police uncovered a spine-chilling murder mystery late Wednesday with the confessions of a mother and her son in the slaying of the boy's drunken step-father.

Anthony Brewbaker, 16, and his mother, Gladys Martin, 35, signed statements obtained by Police Capt. Ray Johnson in which they detailed their parts in the fatal shooting of Robert Martin, 32, early Monday in the family car.

Brewbaker confessed he shot and killed his stepfather while his mother admitted she was the mastermind of the plot.

**Hitchhiker Blamed**  
Mrs. Martin also admitted blaming the murder on a "phantom" hitchhiker which began a three-state manhunt for the killer.

Johnson said Brewbaker's 12-year-old sister, Marianne, who also was in the car when the shooting occurred, took no part in it but knew of the plot beforehand.

Mrs. Martin and the children were expected to be transferred either today or Friday from the city jail here to the Lake County criminal court at Crown Point where charges will be filed.

In her statement, Mrs. Martin said constant marital strife had marred the last four or five years of her marriage to Martin. She said the decision to kill her husband was made some time ago.

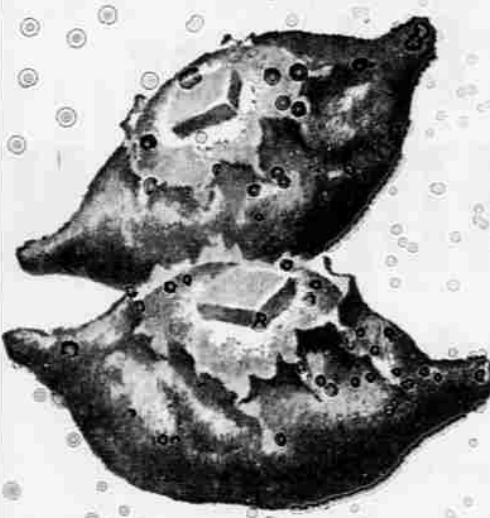

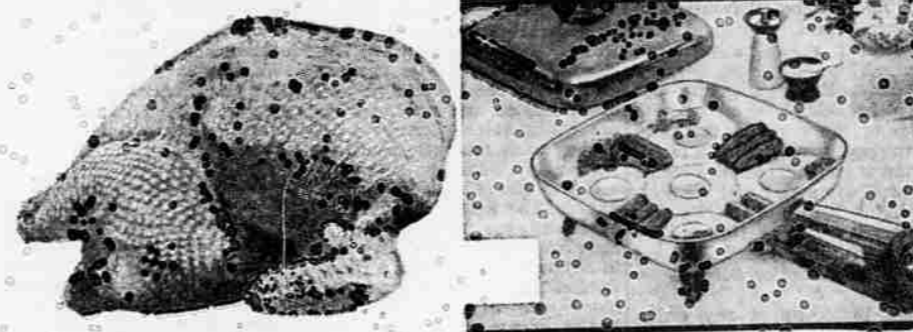
