The Family Council

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice, it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Kenneth D.—I can't tell the children their mother will die. Myra F. They must be awakened to the truth.

Kenneth D.—Six months ago I learned that my wife has an incurable illness. The doctors believe she has about another year to live. My wife suspects, but doesn't really know her condition.

We have four children, ranging in age from 8 to 17. They don't know their mother's real condition either and I can't bring myself to tell the older ones.

As things are now going, the kids behave in their normal way and sometimes give my wife quite a hard time. My wife also tries to do too much in the home. The doctor says to let her do as much as she can, but my sister-in-law feels that my wife's life might be lengthened and happier if she were forced to take it easy and says that the older children should be told.

Myra F.—The doctors know a lot, but they don't know everything. I happen to know that my sister has driven herself beyond the limits of her strength all her life. Why should she do it to the bitter end?

She has spoiled her children. They think nothing of rising from the dinner table and going in to watch TV without one of them giving her so much as a hand in clearing the table and helping with the dishes.

They take no responsibility for cleaning their own rooms and doing their personal laundry. The only way to wake them up is to tell them the full truth.

If they are decent children, and I believe that basically they are, they will manage to protect their mother's feelings.

The Council: It is understandably difficult for this father to reveal the full tragic truth to any of his children, but he should consider that someday his children may have to face a still more bitter fact—that they were inconsiderate, perhaps even cruel, to their mother during her last days on earth. At that time, they may even blame their father for not warning them. They would not be able to forgive themselves or him.

At the same time, it is essential that these children should be able to master their emotions and carefully conceal their grief and terror from their mother. Her morale is now held together by the need to prove it to herself and her family that she is a well woman. The children must understand this. They would have to show that they have changed their irresponsible ways, not so much because of her illness, but because the family should be more cooperative and it is not right for Mother to bear the brunt of all the

Syria Patrols Clash With Israeli Forces

London—(UPI)—Syrian and Israeli patrols clashed yesterday in the spreading Middle East war and a Syrian spokesman said some Syrian units penetrated Israel before withdrawing.

Israeli and Egyptian forces already were locked in battle in the Sinai Peninsula and an Anglo-French invasion force was believed hovering off the Suez Canal.

Egypt reported two major air raids against five Egyptian cities and said seven persons died when British planes attacked the Egyptian capital. Britain said attacks were only against military objectives outside the cities.
