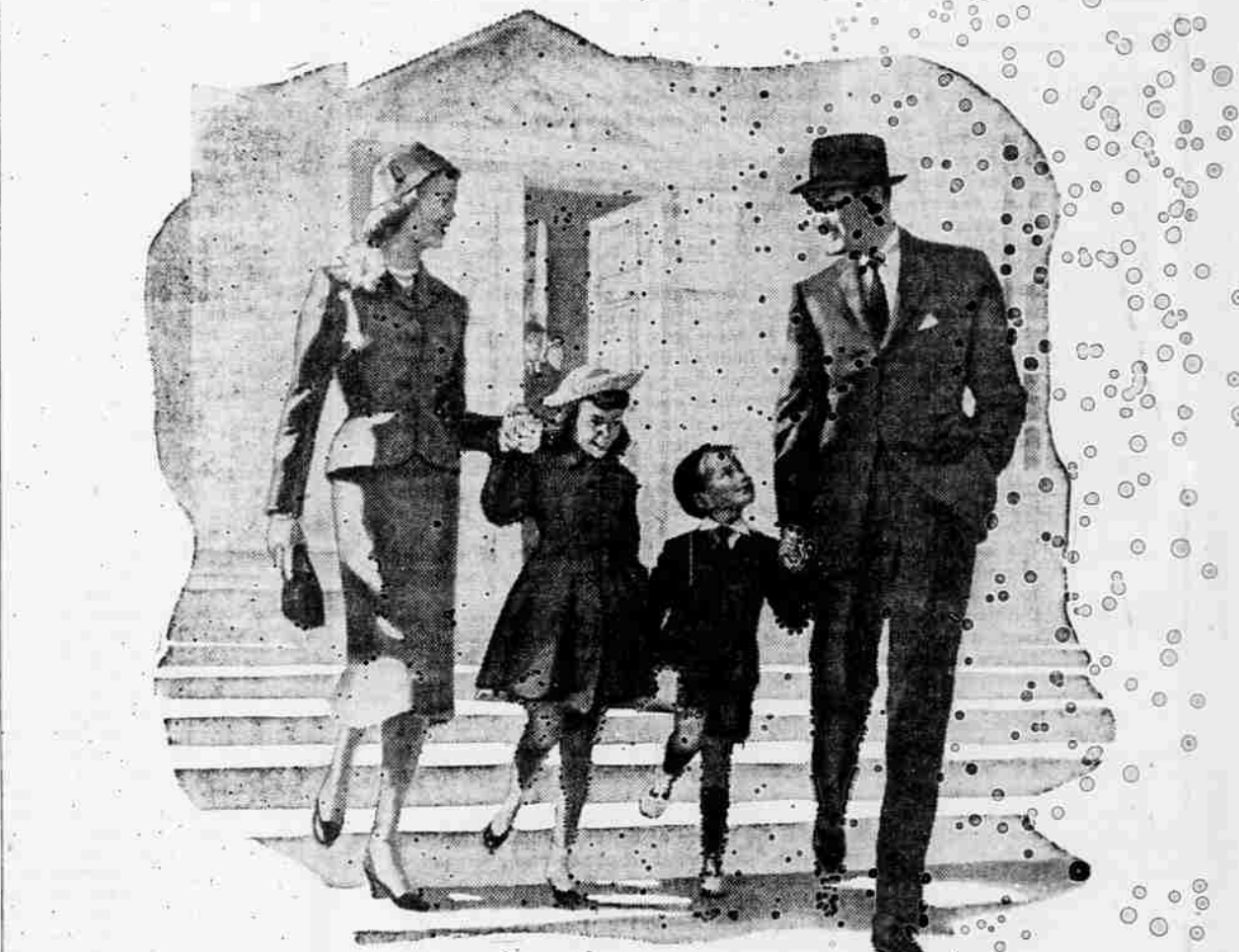
'Hidden Treasure' Theme To Encourage Attendance
