Food Problem for Mom

New York — (UP) — One food authority says it's up to Mom as much as the coach to keep the high school hero in shape, whether he is the football captain or a sub on the debating team.

"Mothers feeding growing high school athletes have a greater feeding problem than coaches and trainers for college and professional athletes," said Albert R. Fleischmann, vice president of Standard Brands.

Fleischmann told the recent Food Editors' Conference here that the protein needs of a growing high school athlete are about the same as those for a non-athletic growing boy.

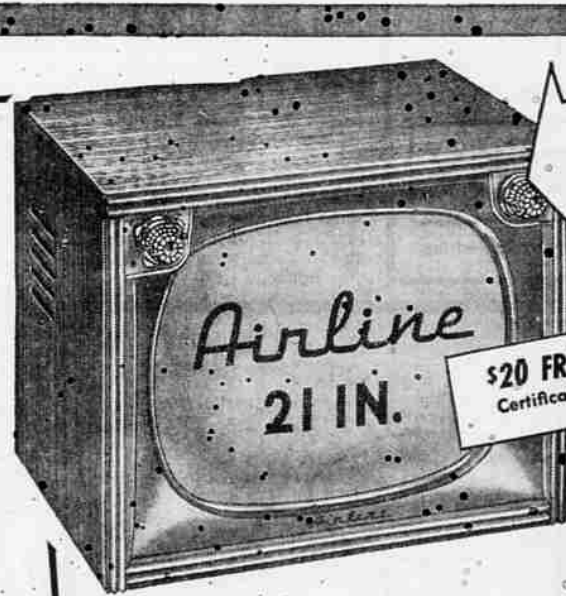
