After the passage of these bills, the program of getting light and power to the rural areas by the REA's moved along, giving thousands of rural homes light and other conveniences.

After Douglas McKay became Secretary of the Interior, a change took place. The Bonneville power with lower rates was expected to get here, by way of Bend, got here all right, but in the hands of a private company, with rates that are said to be the highest in the nation. These rates bite deep into the farmers' income, and in irrigating, often amount to more than he can get for the irrigated crop.

Running for the important office of U. S. Senator are Wayne Morse, a Democrat, and Douglas McKay of my own party.

I highly appreciate what Mr. McKay did for his country, in war times, but as a cabinet member I am afraid he was no match for the powerful lobbyists, so numerous in Washington, D.C. Judging from his past actions, should he be selected senator, the power and oil companies would have a field day, and "yard sticks" competition from public plants would be practically nil.

In turning over the Hells Canyon dam site to an eastern power company, spilling the natural site for power site for power and flood control, he did untold damage to the State of Oregon.

Wayne Morse, the Democrat, a farmer himself, is immune to the high pressure lobbyists, is experienced, believes that the farmers' living standards should be equal to that of other professions, and works constantly toward that end.
