**Three Western
Congressmen Get
Committee Favor**

Washington, D. C.—(Special) Three westerners, all of them Democratic members of congress, were among those receiving the endorsement of the National Committee for an Effective Congress last week.

Five of those endorsed are Republicans and seven are Democrats.

The westerners are Sen. Wayne L. Morse, seeking reelection from Oregon, Frank Church, seeking a senate seat from Idaho, and Mrs. Gracie Pfoz, seeking reelection to congress from Idaho.

The non-partisan committee stated the endorsements are based on "careful evaluation of the personal qualifications, experience and record in public life of the candidates. Each of those endorsed has demonstrated marked capacity and mature judgment. Ethical standards and the tone and quality of congress will be elevated by their election."

Primary Considerations
Primary considerations, they said, are "character, courage and ability," rather than adherence to any party or program.

Others receiving the committee's endorsement were John Sherman Cooper (R-Ky.), R. M. Evans (D-Ia.), Richard Stengel (D-Ill.), Claude Wickard (D-Ind.), and Alexander Wiley (R-Wisc.), all candidates for the senate, and William H. Ayres (R-O.), James G. Fulton (R-Pa.), John W. Heselton (R-Mass.), Eugene McCarthy (D-Minn.), and Hugh Scott (R-Pa.).

**Richardson Named
To Parole Board**

Salem—(UP)—Gov Elmo Smith Saturday announced the appointment of James J. (Jimmy) Richardson, Portland, as a member of the State Board of Parole and Probation.

Richardson will fill the unexpired term of Harry V. Collins, Salem, who resigned effective Dec. 1. Richardson has served for 29 years as general manager of the Multnomah Athletic club and Multnomah Stadium in Portland. Richardson was originally appointed by Gov. Douglas McKay in 1949 as a member of the board. He was re-appointed in 1953 by Gov. Paul Patterson. Soon after his re-appointment, however, he was forced to resign because of the pressure of business.

The governor praised Collins for his service on the board and thanked him for his constructive contributions.

Richardson has been a leading figure in athletic and civic affairs of Oregon for more than a third of a century. He was varsity baseball coach and general manager of athletics at Oregon State college early in his sports career and for a time was business manager of the Seattle Baseball club. He is a past president of the Oregon AAU and a member of the U.S. Olympic Boxing Committee. More recently he has been vice chairman of the Portland Exposition-Recreation commission.
