## Around Hollywood

Hollywood—(U.P.)—Hollywood changes department: Yvonne De Carlo has abdicated her post of an international glamour girl and Hollywood's most traveled beauty to be a "much calmer" stay-at-home mama.

Until Yvonne neepled to Reno with stunt man Bob Morgan, she was dancing on the French Riviera, being courted by princes and turning up in Persia or Italy long before even Ava Gardner took up that life.

But when I took out a visa to travel to her hilltop home with the idea of seeing how an international beauty lives, she happily was bouncing her six-months-old son on her one-time chesecake knee.

Everything," said Yvonne. "Especially at work. I used to be so restless. Travel is an escape. You look for something in one place, but there's nothing, so, boom, you go someplace else."

Talk Turns to Babies  
"I'm very happy now," she continued. "I used to pooh-pooh this baby business. When people talked about babies I talked about my dogs. Now I talk about babies."

Travel Increases Knowledge

The blue-eyed actress made several pictures overseas, including "Hotel Sahara" and "Captain's Paradise," and doing so kept her renewing her passport and forgetting laundry in various cities.

## Gas Dealer Speaks To Roundtable Group

Victor Milnes, president of Fortune Stations Inc., Medford, and secretary of the Oregon State Gasoline Dealers association, discussed the economics of the gasoline business and how it affects this community at the noon luncheon of the Jackson Chamber of Commerce Roundtable Monday.

Most of the petroleum used in the Medford area, Milnes said, is produced in southern California and shipped to refineries in the San Francisco bay area. The gasoline is shipped to Crescent City by barge, he said, and transported to Medford by truck and trailer.

More Petroleum Products  
There are now 10 times as many products being made from petroleum as there were a few years ago, Milnes said. He added that prices for gasoline and petroleum by-products have increased much less in price than other commodities during the past several years.

The transportation charges in shipping gasoline from San Francisco to Medford is 3 1/2 cents per gallon, he pointed out, "which is high." Profit for the major oil company distributor added to the refinery cost plus freight rates, he said make up the wholesale price of major gas in Medford. Local dealers are not responsible for the wholesale cost of gas, he added.

Shipping Explained  
Small independent companies in southern California cannot ship gas to Medford economically because there are no independent facilities in Crescent City, Milnes said. Major refineries can economically ship gasoline to Medford, he explained, because they have their own storage plants in Crescent City.

Most service stations have to make six cents on a gallon of gas to "just exist," he said. About 3 1/2 cents per gallon goes for labor and one cent each for rent and miscellaneous overhead. This usually leaves one-half cent per gallon for the operator's profits, he said.

A price war is a "frightening thing" to a service station operator, Milnes said, as it can ruin his entire economy. Consignment Stations  
Major gasoline companies have recently started "consignment stations," where they furnish the equipment and gasoline for an operator, who they hire, and control the prices and operations of the station.

Milnes stated that, in his opinion, price wars were not democratic as they can be started by one man, station or company. This is not fair to a competitor, he said, if he wants to maintain his economy by keeping price stable because of the pressures that work against him.

Eugene Price War  
There is now a price war in Eugene, he said, in which the stations are selling gas for more than four cents under their usual retail prices. A similar price war in the Medford area would cost about \$60,000 a month in income to the community. Therefore, he added, price wars are only "false bargains" to the customer.

Purpose of price wars, he explained, is to take unfair advantage of a competitor. After the price war the operator who started it hopes to keep customers in the habit of coming into his station, Milnes commented.

In Portland an ordinance has been passed limiting the size of "price signs" and there has not been a price war in Portland since, he said.
