

### Resuscitator, Oxygen Tent Revive Baby

James Weiskamp, 14-month-old son of Mr. and Mrs. C. F. Weiskamp, 927 Brookdale ave., was reported in "good" condition today at Sacred Heart hospital after wrapping a venetian blind cord around his neck and falling at his home Monday.

According to the report, the child's breathing had stopped when his parents discovered the accident. The father attempted to restore the boy's breathing and Medford Ambulance service was called.

A resuscitator was used to restore his breathing and he was placed under an oxygen tent. Attendants at Sacred Heart hospital said the child is expected to be released in a day or two.

### Mid-East Oil Flow Said Cut One-Fourth

London — (UP) — One-fourth of the world's entire oil production was cut off or endangered today by the war in the Middle East.

Furious Arab nationalists were blowing up pipelines running across the deserts from oil fields to ports. A pall of smoke 10,000 feet high was reported in Syria over the pipeline of the British controlled Iraq Oil Company.

Cairo Radio said American owned oil installations also had been destroyed or damaged. It said the Bahrain Petroleum Company, a subsidiary of the Caltex Company, had been set afire and destroyed. The pipelines of the Arabian American Oil Company in Saudi Arabia were said to have been damaged in three places.

### Cahill Seen Headed For State Prison

Newport, Ore. — (UP) — Otto Cahill, former official of a water district in Lincoln county, apparently has lost the final round in his running battle to keep out of the state penitentiary.

Lincoln County District Attorney A. R. McMullen said today he received a telegram from the clerk of the U.S. Supreme court announcing that the high court had refused to hear an appeal filed in behalf of Cahill or to review the case.

The former Air Force officer was convicted in August, 1954, of taking \$750 from funds of the Taft-Nelso-Delake water district. He served as secretary of the district until recalled.

### Switzerland Appeals For Big Four Meeting

Bern, Switzerland — (UP) — Switzerland appealed today to the Big Four to meet in this neutral country to prevent World War III.

It proposed that Indian also attend the conference as a representative of the Bandung Afro-Asian powers.

The appeal was made in telegrams sent by the Swiss Federal council to President Eisenhower and the chiefs of government of Britain, France, Soviet Russia and India.

"The danger of a third world war with all its tragic consequences is weighing on mankind," it said. "Peace can and must be saved."

### Hoover Denies Ties In Middle East Oil

New York — (UP) — Former President Herbert Hoover denied today that his son, Undersecretary of State Herbert Hoover Jr., or the Hoover family had any personal interests in Middle East oil.

Mr. Hoover, in a statement issued here, said: "A statement in St. Paul Saturday, Nov. 3, that Herbert Hoover Jr. and members of the Hoover family had personal interests in Middle East oil is an absolute lie."

"And I might add that Herbert Hoover Jr., not only re-

signed all of his professional connections but also disposed of any business interests anywhere in the world at great sacrifice to himself who accepted the position of undersecretary of state."

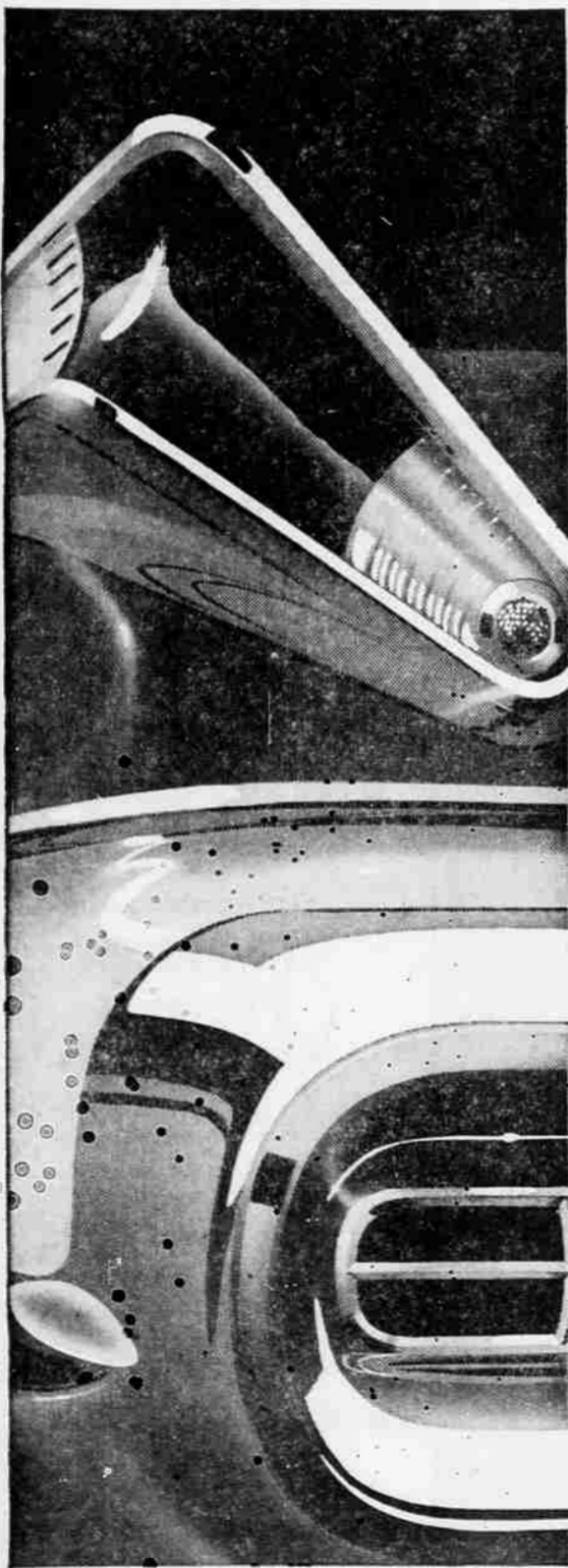
