

# Results of Elections In Communities In County Are Listed

Elections for city offices in nine Jackson county communities were held yesterday, but returns were slow in coming in this morning. In some towns, winners of contests were known, but figures had not been totaled.

**Jacksonville**—John Keavany defeated J. C. Long for the office of mayor in Jacksonville, 171 to 139. Art Davies, who received 250 votes, Wayne Reavis with 252, and Ray Wilson with 215 were elected to council seats, defeating C. P. McBeth who received 178 votes.

The offices of city recorder and treasurer are appointive in Jacksonville.

**Bufile Falls**—Orbra Abbott, who received 76 votes as a write-in candidate, has been elected mayor here. He was opposed on the ballot by incumbent Mayor E. Poole.

Incumbent city councilmen re-elected were Bruce Tingle, 134, Gordon Walker, 126, and Knute Johnson, 146. New councilmen elected are Henry Davies, 46, and Page Stauffer with 44 votes.

In the race for a council position, Elva Abbott and William Norling were tied with 10 votes each. The mayor will appoint one of the candidates to the council.

Incumbents Kizzie Edmundson, city recorder, and E. W. Smith, city treasurer, were also re-elected with votes of 142 and 12, respectively.

**Talent**—F. E. Christian was elected mayor here Tuesday over his only opponent, A. V. Read. Christian received 178 votes to Read's 132.

Incumbent city councilmen re-elected in the election are C. W. Cooper, 289; Leo F. Jacobs, 206; John H. Henry, 203; Wayne Reichstein, 174; and Clifford Nicholson, 210. New councilman elected was John Butler, with 207 votes.

Other candidates for the council were Howard Lockwood, 170; Joseph Silva, 134; Vance Gage, 134; and Linden B. Moberly, 143.

Incumbent City Recorder Mrs. Nona McAbee and incumbent Treasurer C. G. Sharp, both unopposed, were re-elected. Mrs. McAbee received 282 votes and Sharp received 280.

**Central Point**—Donald E. Faber, incumbent, defeated Wesley Boham in the race for mayor in Central Point and Robert Padgett, William Saxbury and Alfred M. Setness were elected to hold council seats for the next term, defeating Ed McKain, O. W. Panter, Elsworth Robison and Harold Boner.

Lyle Paul defeated incumbent Arden Pinkham for the office of recorder. Treasurer Edward W. Jones was unopposed.

Figures on election were not available late this morning.

**Gold Hill**—E. H. Cooper, candidate for mayor, defeated Milton Steinmetz by a margin of 168 to 81 in Gold Hill and Ferd Jones, incumbent recorder-treasurer defeated J. Fred Lewis 186 to 73.

Four four-year councilmen, Harry Foley received 221 votes, Virgil Gribble, 210, and Truman O. Price, 197. They were unopposed. Also unopposed for the office of two-year councilman were Kendal Dufay with 198 and Edward V. Tulare with 196 votes.

**Rogue River**—Phil B. Angle, unopposed, was re-elected mayor of Rogue River for another term, along with recorder Orva Jean Cruise, and treasurer Lois O. Morgans who were also unopposed. The total number of votes received by each has not been tabulated.

Elected for councilman were Al Babcock with 172 votes, Donald Stamm with 183, and John B. H. Leyen with 73, defeating Richard S. Niquette, who had 151 votes.

Phoenix—All the candidates for city offices were unopposed in this election.

Vine Claffin is the new mayor in Phoenix, replacing Dan Adams, who did not run for office. Councilmen who will serve for the next term are H. R. Jensen, T. J. Marra, J. G. Klassen, incumbents, and A. H. MacKintosh.

Tabulation of the total number of votes will not be made until this evening. The city recorder and treasurer are appointive offices.

**Ashland**—Incumbent Mayor Richard Neill was re-elected here Tuesday with 2,832 unofficial votes. He was unopposed.

Candidates elected to the three city council positions were Ewald (Walt) Bosshard, receiving 2,308 unofficial votes; Glenn M. Revel, 2,149; and Leroy C. Oslander, 1,950.

Other candidates were Ralph Koozer, 1,429; and Harry R. Morris, 1,576. They were both incumbents.

Incumbent City Recorder W. E. Bartlett and incumbent Treasurer Paul L. Finnell, both unopposed, were re-elected. Bartlett received 2,855 votes and Finnell received 2,933.

Elected to fill two positions on the city park commission was Elton Scripser, with 2,309 votes; and Frank Barnhouse, 2,009. Only other candidate was Mildred Ager, who received 1,993 votes.

Incumbent Archie Fries, who was recently appointed to fill an unexpired term on the park commission, was re-elected with 2,898 votes. He was unopposed.

Mrs. Nelle Burns, Ashland district justice of the peace for a number of years, was re-elected by a slim margin yesterday. Her opponent was L. Peers Wilmeth, former city judge in Ashland.

The unofficial count in the district was for Mrs. Burns 4,936; for Wilmeth, 4,898.

**Eagle Point**—O. R. Fresham was elected mayor here Tuesday receiving 228 unofficial votes. He was unopposed.

Incumbent City Council members re-elected were Don McGovern, with 216 votes and Shirley Callaghan, 231. Don Ashpole, retiring mayor, was also elected to the council with 242 votes. They were all unopposed.

The positions of city recorder and treasurer are appointed by the council after the election.
