

Ike's Cabinet Seen Unchanged; Dulles Said Possible Exception

Washington — (U.P.) — President Eisenhower's second-term cabinet will be the same as it is now, at least for a while — with one possible exception.

The exception would be Secretary of State John Foster Dulles. Mr. Eisenhower wants Dulles to stay on, and Dulles himself has indicated he would like to continue. But the final decision probably will rest with the secretary's doctors.

Dulles underwent surgery Saturday for removal of an intestinal cancer. Present indications are that he will be able to return to his desk in six weeks. But that is not a certainty. If his doctors should determine that Dulles cannot carry on — and there is no such indication at this time — Mr. Eisenhower would have to cast around for a successor.

Dewey Mentioned
The name of former Gov. Tho-

mas E. Dewey of New York has been mentioned most frequently for secretary of state if Dulles steps aside. Henry Cabot Lodge Jr., chief U. S. delegate to the United Nations, also has been mentioned for the job.

Except for the uncertainty posed by Dulles' health, a United Press survey shows that no other cabinet officers is likely to bow out of the administration at this time — either voluntarily or by request.

This means that the rest of the cabinet lineup would remain:

Secretary of Treasury — George M. Humphrey of Ohio.

Secretary of Defense — Charles E. Wilson, of Michigan.

Attorney general — Herbert Brownell Jr. of New York.

Postmaster general — Arthur E. Summerfield of Michigan.

Secretary of interior — Fred A. Seaton of Nebraska.

Secretary of agriculture — Ezra Taft Benson of Utah.

Secretary of commerce — Sinclair Weeks of Massachusetts.

Secretary of labor — James P. Mitchell of New Jersey.

Secretary of health, education and welfare — Marion B. Folsom of New York.

There have been reports that at least two of these would like to retire after the second term.

Eisenhower Thanks Stevenson for Pledge

Washington — (U.P.) — President Eisenhower today thanked his defeated opponent, Adlai E. Stevenson, for his good wishes and his pledge of cooperation.

As his first order of business today Mr. Eisenhower sent a telegram to Stevenson replying to Stevenson's congratulatory message.

"I am grateful for your message of good wishes," the President said. "In these difficult and uncertain days it is heartening to have your affirmation of the fact that the people of our country are united."

"I appreciate greatly your pledge of cooperation for the immediate future and for the four years that lie ahead."

The President was scheduled to hold a conference this morning with Acting Secretary of State, Herbert Hoover Jr. on the still critical international situation.

Oregonian Appointed Acting Fishery Director

Portland — (U.P.) — Arnie J. Suomela, state director of fisheries in Oregon from 1945 to 1954, yesterday was named as acting director of the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries. The post will be under the newly reorganized Fish and Wildlife Service.

Suomela had been associate director of the Fish and Wildlife Service which was split by a law passed by the last Congress. He will now head one of the two bureau's created.
