Hollywood — (U.P.) — Marlon Brando in a bikini suit by the swimming pool... Montgomery Clift in the penthouse... and Greta Garbo in the garage... What other hotel but the Chateau Marmont can make that statement... The old establishment, a block off Sunset Blvd., has assumed the title of "Grand Hotel" for the entertainment world.

The Marmont is so exclusive many folks often can't get in. When Brando lived there before renting a house he showed off a bikini bathing suit he picked up in Japan. Marilyn Monroe bunked at the Chateau while she was working on "Bus Stop" and the switchboard lit up every night with calls from her then suitor, Arthur Miller.

Langlie Trimmed By Sen. Magnuson

Seattle — (U.P.) — President Eisenhower apparently took Washington's vice electoral votes but his hand picked candidate for the Senate was defeated.

Returns from 1,001 of this state's 4782 precincts gave Mr. Eisenhower 218,853 votes to 187,658 for Democrat Adlai E. Stevenson.

However, Gov. Arthur B. Langlie had already conceded defeat in his bid for a Senate seat to incumbent Democrat Warren G. Magnuson.

Magnuson held a 252,752 to 153,690 lead over Langlie. Langlie, three-time governor of the state, was asked by Mr. Eisenhower to wage a campaign to unseat Magnuson, a veteran of 12 years service in the upper house.

Albert Rosellini, a Democrat, was apparently headed for victory in the gubernatorial race against Lt. Gov. Emmett T. Anderson.

Five incumbent Republican congressmen were leading by comfortable margins. Only one race was close. In that one Republican incumbent Hal Holmes led Frank LeRoux by a fairly narrow margin.

Democrat Don Magnuson, incumbent congressman-at-large won reelection defeating Republican Philip Evans of Seattle.

Actor Recuperates
After Cliff had his front-page automobile accident he recuperated in the Marmont penthouse. His longtime friend, Libby Holman Reynolds, flew to his side and arranged for the suite.

Garbo usually stays at the Marmont when she is in Hollywood. On one trip she saw actor Richard Burton tinkering with his car in the garage and mistook him for the attendant. Burton happily parked her car.

Veteran stars such as the Gish sisters and Helen Hays stay at the apartment-hotel when in Hollywood. And currently the old (or California) establishment is the vogue for young TV and stage players from New York, who apparently huddle together for protection and—or comfort.

Management Shuns Publicity
The management of the exclusive Marmont is publicity shy, so details about the Hollywood landmark have to be ferreted out of the tenants. Currently, they include Anthony Perkins (the star of "Friendly Persuasion"), Tom Ewell, Imogene Coca, Boris Karloff and Jane Dulo of the "Hey, Jeannie" TV series.

The building was constructed in 1929 in Moorish-Italian-early-CB. DeMille architecture, which was popular at the time. The Chateau has no "hotel" facilities such as room service.

"We cater to show people and don't disturb them," the housekeeper says. "Most people don't know the hotel is here so we have privacy."

Actor Paul Kelly Dies of Heart Attack

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Actor Paul Kelly died of a heart attack today shortly after returning from casting his vote at the polls.

The veteran actor's wife, Mardell, was present at the time of his death, friends reported. In addition to his widow, Kelly is survived by a daughter, Mimi Kelly, of New York.

The handsome, jut-jawed actor was 57 years old. Kelly suffered the heart attack after returning to his Beverly Hills home from voting. The family doctor was called immediately and he administered a stimulant in a vain attempt to save Kelly's life. The doctor pronounced him dead at about 2:45 p.m. (PST).

Church Defeats Welker in Idaho

Boise, Ida. — (U.P.) — Democrat Frank Church, 32, a political neophyte, piled up a surprising near 40,000 vote majority today to oust Republican Herman Welker from the U. S. Senate.

Church won despite a heavy vote in favor of President Eisenhower. Church was running for major political office for the first time.

Returns from 744 precincts out of the state's 893 gave President Eisenhower 139,077 votes to Adlai E. Stevenson's 86,590. Welker conceded his seat to

Church at 12:25 a.m. today after the new senator picked up a lead of about 35,000 votes in the three-way race. Former Sen. Glen H. Taylor, who ran as a write-in candidate, conceded earlier.

The senate vote, with 744 precincts reported, was Welker 86,485, Church, 121,844; and Taylor, 8,891.

Idaho's two members of Congress won reelection. Democratic Representative Gracie Pfoz was leading Republican contender Louise Shaddock, 46,942 to 39,012, with 307 out of the first District's 401 precincts reporting. Miss Shaddock conceded.

Republican Rep. Hamer Budget led Democrat John Reynolds, 77,714 to 51,794 with 437 out of 492 precincts reporting. Reynolds conceded.

Arizona Gives Ike Whopping Majority

Phoenix — (U.P.) — Democratic Arizona, which has never picked a loser in a presidential race, stayed with President Eisenhower Tuesday, giving him a whopping majority over Adlai E. Stevenson.

Returns from 453 of the state's 521 precincts gave him 119,468 votes to Stevenson's 71,965.

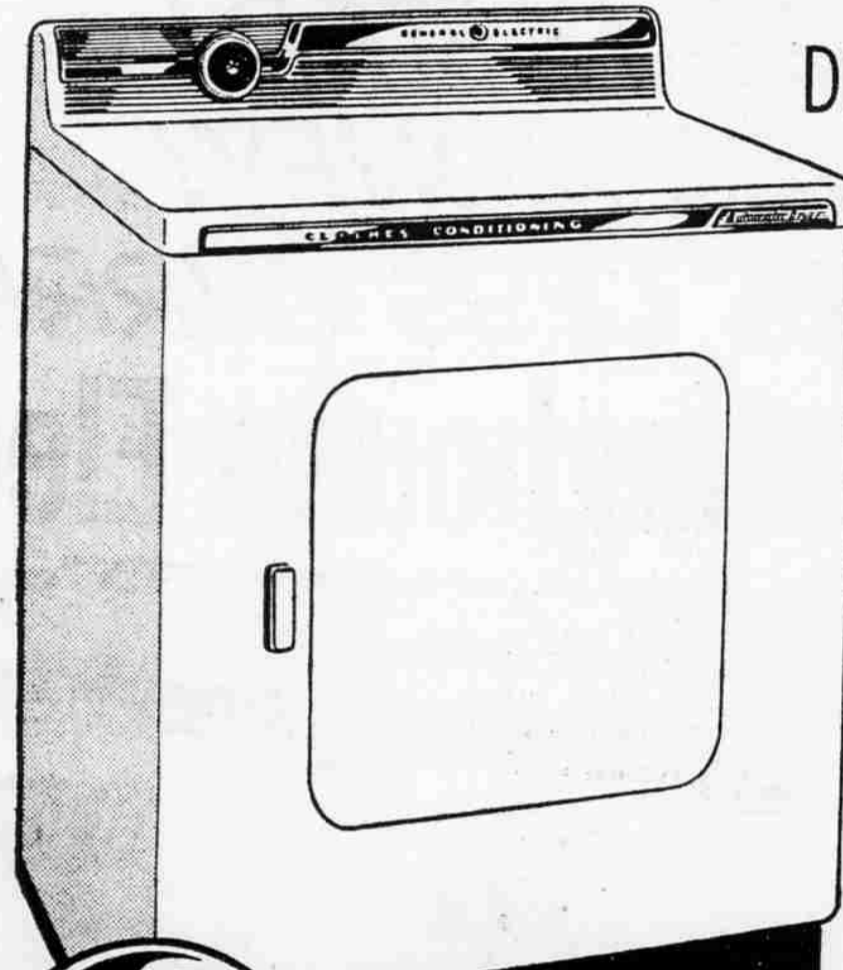
Incumbents generally had a good day in Arizona, as the voters maintained the status quo among high office holders in and from Arizona.

Sen. Carl Hayden, who has never lost a political battle in 52 years and has been a member of Congress since Arizona became a state in 1912, won his

sixth term in the Senate, defeating Ross Jones, Republican attorney from Phoenix. The victory makes Hayden the dean of the Senate, now that Sen. Walter George (D-Ga.) is retiring.
