### Intelligence Test

#### Developed for Blind

Chicago—U.P.—A new intelligence test has been developed for the blind.

It is designed to measure more accurately their vocational capabilities.

The test was developed by Dr. S. E. Watson, who got his doctorate in psychology recently at the Illinois Institute of Technology, and Dr. Harriett Shurragger, assistant professor of psychology.

To achieve an accurate intelligence score for the blind, they combined the verbal phase of the standard IQ test with the performance test which seeks to measure manual dexterity and perceptual ability without the usual cues.

Watson said the standard IQ test alone does not adequately test a blind person's capabilities because it has been found that some people who score high in the verbal phase score low in the performance scale, and vice versa.

The standard IQ test also includes a performance test, but it requires sight.

### Bank Collects Bank Note 104 Years Old

West Chester, Pa.—U.P.—Edward Hoopes was cleaning out some papers that had belonged to his father and came across a yellowed slip of paper—a note for \$5.

It has been issued in 1832 and was signed by Washington Townsend, cashier, and William Darlington, president of the Bank of Chester County.

Hoopes knew that this bank had become the National Bank of Chester County in 1864 and, later, the National Bank of Chester County and Trust Co.

So he took the note to the bank, turned it in, and received a \$5 bill. Nobody remembered what it had been issued for 104 years ago.

### Miniature License Tag Aid To Lost Kitten
