Mrs. Tyrrell Dies In Yreka Hospital

Hornbrook — Mrs. Alice A. Tyrrell, 93, died Monday Nov. 5, at the Siskiyou General hospital in Yreka, where she had been a patient for the past two weeks.

Funeral services were held Friday afternoon at Girdner's funeral chapel in Yreka, with the Rev. Harold Coleman, of the Methodist church in Yreka, officiating.

Burial was in the family plot at the Henly-Hornbrook cemetery. Pall bearers were: Paul Greene, Lawrence Breceda, Clyde Landon, Robert Cummins, George McCann and Ed Smith. Substituting for Robert Cummins at the graveside was Charles Spearin.

Mrs. Tyrrell, who had made her home in Hornbrook for 64 years, was born near Eureka, Calif., on July 26, 1863. Her parents were pioneers who had come across the plains in a covered wagon train. Her father was an old-time circuit rider, and she could recall riding with him in a horse and buggy on the old Oregon trail, as he made his rounds through this territory.

They would stop at the old store in Henly, which was the original town of Hornbrook, to water their horses, and to buy flour. Crossing the Klamath river was accomplished by swimming the horses.

She and her husband, Oscar, observed their 60th wedding anniversary shortly before his death in 1938.

Of the 10 children born to them, four survive. They are: Mrs. Zela Elmore, Hornbrook; Mrs. Evva Gandy, Eugene; Mrs. Ida Henderson, Oroville, Calif.; and Alvin Tyrrell, Willow Creek, Calif.

There are also 20 grandchildren, two of whom are Floyd and Ardun Burns, 28 great grandchildren, and seven great great grandchildren. One brother, Perry Randles, of Richmond, Calif., also survives.

New Highway 99 Couplet Opened

Ashland — The new northbound couplet on U.S. Highway 99 in Ashland was opened at 8 a.m. Saturday, changing the city's downtown traffic pattern.

The new couplet takes off Siskiyou boulevard at the fire station, swings down to C st. and its extension over Ashland creek then returns to the present Highway 99 at the Presbyterian church. Southbound traffic will continue in its present pattern.

Colored sandbags are being placed near the fire station, Presbyterian church and on the Plaza, pending completion of traffic control islands. Paving of intersections in the northbound couplet will be done within the next few days, according to a report from the state highway department district office at Roseburg.

Three small islands dividing north and southbound traffic at the Plaza will be combined into a single long island with a sidewalk. Parking will be permitted on the north side of Main st., as well as along the island side.

Access for northbound traffic to the Plaza section of the business district will be from Oak, Water and Church sts. Meters on the north side of Main st. will be reversed.
