The Family Council

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice, it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Mrs. J. H.—Our shy daughter wants to marry a man of the world.

Ann H.—My parents don't know the real Victor.

Mrs. J. H.—Our 20-year-old daughter is giving us a hard time. She wants to marry a man 12 years older than herself. This, perhaps, wouldn't be so bad, but this man has been married before, has traveled widely, engaged in an active business and social life and, in general, is a thoroughly sophisticated man of the world.

Ann, on the other hand, has been a very sheltered girl and is a bit immature for her age. She hasn't gone out much socially, is very shy, looks younger than she is, and hardly knows her own mind.

Mr. J. H.—Ann is a pretty girl, but my wife and I can't see what a man of this type sees in her. The mere fact that he could be serious about such an undeveloped girl makes us rather suspicious. We think he is in need of good business connections at this time—and I happen to have them.

Ann H.—Victor is not quite so sophisticated as my parents think. He is very clever and makes people admire him, but he is very different when he is with me.

Victor has told me he always really feels uncomfortable with people—as though he must show off. He said that his first marriage, which was made when he was very young, was unhappy because he chose just the kind of girl people would expect of him—a social, showy type. Victor says he never had the real comfort and pleasure

with her that he has known with me.

I told him of my parents' suspicions about the business angles and he said that while good business connections would be helpful to him at this time, it was the last thing on his mind when he fell in love with me.

The Council: These parents have raised important doubts about this marriage. Anne answers them by a simple, at-face-value acceptance of what Victor has told her.

It is possible that all Victor says is true, but Anne should realize that her parents' objections are serious and call for a good deal of caution. The man is not only older and more sophisticated, but failed in an earlier marriage. Perhaps that was entirely his wife's fault, but it remains a fact that he did not choose well the first time.

Ann does not appear quite so undeveloped as her parents think. She shows that she is straightforward in her relationship with her parents and with Victor. She shows no undue rebelliousness. But she should realize that it is natural for a girl like herself to be easily moved by the plea of an apparently sophisticated man, who claims he is really very insecure—except when he is with her. It could be the statement of a very calculating man.

Ann should be willing to give her parents and herself more time to observe this man. This is the only way to determine his sincerity and real worth.

Albany Woman Fears Insanity; Drowns Son

Albany, Ore. — (UPI) — Mrs. Shirley Albeke, 21, phoned Albany Chief of Police Ray H. Maddy Saturday and told him: "I have drowned my son."

Sheriff's officers and county and state police went to the home where they found her three-year-old son Stephen had been drowned.

Deputy Sheriff Wade Collins said Mrs. Albeke told him she feared she was insane and she drowned her son in the belief that he would turn out to be insane. She has another 8-month-old son.

Police took the young mother into custody and indicated that whatever charge might be placed against her probably would be determined Monday. Her husband works in Eugene.

Salary Employment Reaches All-Time High
San Francisco — (UPI) — Wage and salary employment, excluding agricultural and domestic workers, reached an all-time high 1,658,100 in mid-September in the eight mountain states, the Department of Labor reported today.

Max D. Kossoris, Western regional director of the department's Bureau of Labor Statistics, said employment was 10,000 higher than in August and 62,000 above the September, 1955, level for Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming.

Knowland Asks Russ Expulsion From UN

New York — (UPI) — Senate Republican Leader William F. Knowland called Sunday night for expulsion of Russia from the United Nations and for a U.N. crackdown on Britain, France and Israel if they do not remove their troops from Egypt immediately.

Knowland, appearing on the NBC television program "Meet the Press," said Britain, France and Israel could touch off "a major conflict" by "dilly-dallying" on compliance with the U.N. troop removal order.

He said the U.N. crackdown could consist of economic measures such as "cutting off of all credits" and "the embargo of all shipments."

Allied Newsmen Killed by Egyptians

Paris — (UPI) — Two Allied newsmen, an American and a Frenchman, were shot and killed by Egyptian troops near El Kantara in the Suez Canal Zone, the French Ministry of Defense announced today.

They were identified as David Seymour of Magnum Photos and Jean Roy of the Paris weekly Paris-Match.

An earlier dispatch from Anglo-French headquarters on Cyprus had listed them "missing," and a field dispatch from Port Said had held out some hope they might still be alive.

Composer Victor Young Dies at Palm Springs

Hollywood — (UPI) — Funeral services will be held Tuesday for veteran composer-conductor Victor Young, who died in Desert hospital at Palm Springs, Calif., Saturday shortly after suffering a heart attack.

The 56-year-old Young wrote such song hits as "Sweet Sue," "My Foolish Heart," "Love Letters" and "Golden Earrings."

Portland-The Dalles Four-Lane Road Planned

Portland — (UPI) — Completion of a four-lane highway linking Portland and The Dalles by 1962 was announced here Saturday as a tentative goal of the State Highway Commission.

The project, calling for widening of the 67-mile river-level route stretch from Troutdale to The Dalles to a four-lane route, would be one of the major expenditures in Oregon under funds granted by the federal highway bill passed by the last Congress.

Klamath Falls Hunter Injured by Gunshot

Klamath Falls — (UPI) — Bruce Brink, 24-year-old Klamath Falls millworker, was reported in serious condition in a local hospital today from gunshot wounds suffered in a hunting accident. Police said Brink apparently stepped into the line of fire of other hunters while hunting for quail near Dairy about 10 miles from here.

Wilson's Resting Place In Washington Dedicated

Washington — (UPI) — The permanent resting place of Woodrow Wilson was dedicated Sunday in Washington Cathedral.

The body of the 27th president of the United States had been in a vault under the main cathedral floor. It now rests in a special memorial crypt in a new bay of a side aisle on the main floor.
